TOWN'S COMMITMENT TO A SUSTAINABLE PITTSFORD: CCA, LED STREET LIGHTS, SOLAR ENERGY, EV CHARGING STATIONS

Last week Town Supervisor Bill Smith had a productive meeting with Matt Halladay of Genesee/Finger Lakes Regional Planning Council.

The Town's sustainability strategy has been to partner with the GFL RPC staff, leveraging their expertise in clean energy and knowledge of the State's priorities and New York State Energy Research & Development Authority (NYSERDA) initiatives. Doing so enables the Town to make decisions on available opportunities and move quickly to take advantage of grants and rebates available to municipalities.

In the meeting Supervisor Smith and Mr. Halladay discussed the Community Choice Aggregation (CCA) program. CCA allows participating local governments to procure an energy supply on behalf of its utility customers. Joining with other municipalities puts Pittsford in a stronger position to be able to provide residents with energy from 100% renewable sources, at a cost lower than the regular RG&E rate. Also discussed was the Town Administration's plan to proceed with the RG&E LED Street Light Conversion program. This program applies to the "cobra" style street light, of which there are approximately 115 in the Town. Such a conversion would pay for itself in the near term with reduced energy and maintenance cost.

The Town of Pittsford's commitment to sustainability goes back at least as far as our Greenprint plan, which preserved two-thirds of the then-remaining farmland in Town in the 1990s. We have carried on with that commitment through the years, more recently earning designation by the State in 2017 as a Clean Energy Community and successfully competing for a State grant in 2018 to solarize the lodges at King's Bend Park and to install a second electric vehicle charging station. The Town will continue with its forward thinking and actions to make sure Pittsford has a sustainable future.

YARD DEBRIS PICKUP DUE TO RECENT WIND STORMS

Addressing snow and ice on our streets and walkways currently is our main priority but we realize many yards are filled with branches and debris from recent wind storms. Our Town crews will make their way through town to pick up yard debris in the next few weeks, as weather allows. Residents may place yard

ORDERS DUE MARCH 1 FOR COUNTY'S TREE, SHRUB AND PLANT PRE-ORDER PROGRAM

Friday, March 2 is the deadline for the Monroe County Soil and Water (MCSW) Conservation District's annual Tree, Shrub, and Plant pre-order program. It's not too early to plan for your spring planting project - and your order can help conservation efforts in our area! The pre-order program is currently underway and offers a wide variety of evergreens, hardwood trees, shrubs, wildflowers, groundcovers, seed mixes, plant variety conservation packs, and even enhancement items like bluebird nesting boxes and bat roosting boxes! Proceeds from the annual sale will benefit the MCSW Conservation District's education and preservation programs.

The program offers great choices for suburban conservationists, including an edible fruit multi-pack option - featuring two plants each of cold tolerant strawberry, raspberry, blackberry, and two varieties of blueberry - and a wildlife food plot seed mix for those interested in improving wildlife habitat. Packages range in unit size and price, from a bundle of 10 plants for as low as \$10, to bundles of 100 plants for as low as \$70.

Native species new to the program this year Tulip Poplar, Buttonbush, Persimmon, River Birch and more.

SEASONAL PARKING RESTRICTIONS IN EFFECT THROUGH APRIL 1, 2019

In order to facilitate snow removal Town of Pittsford seasonal parking restrictions are in effect from November 15 (this Thursday) through April 1, 2019. Parking of any vehicle on public roads - including state highways and on the shoulder of all roads - is prohibited each year from November 15 through April 1 in all areas within the Town and outside of the Village. Please note violators may be ticketed or towed. Help us keep our roadways safe - during this time, please don't park on or along public roads outside of the Village.
