## CHAMBER'S CANDLELIGHT NIGHT IS THIS TUESDAY, DECEMBER 3

The Pittsford Chamber of Commerce presents the **48th annual** <u>Candlelight Night</u> this Tuesday, December 3 from 5:00-8:00pm in Pittsford Village.

South Main Street will be closed between the Four Corners (Main and State Streets) and Church Street to accommodate pedestrians, **food trucks** and activities. A **free shuttle** will be available from Pittsford Sutherland High School (55 Sutherland Street) to the Village center. Village businesses will be open for the evening and **live reindeer**, **horse-drawn wagon rides**, **tree lightings** at 6:00pm (Main and State Streets) and 7:00pm (Northfield Common), plenty of **Santa sightings** around the Village, **treats with Mrs. Claus at Historic Pittsford's Little House**, the **Grinch**, a **Kid Zone** at Northfield Common and more will make this a special night.

To capture the spirit of the holidays, singing groups will be found throughout the Village, both inside and outdoors. **Food Vendors** will be located on South and North Main Streets, at Victor Eurpiture in Schoen Place, and at Northfield



Victor Furniture in Schoen Place, and at Northfield Common.

Adding to the fun and excitement, the **5th Annual Candlelight Night Pub Crawl** starts at 7:15pm for the 21 and over crowd. **TOWN 2020 BUDGET AND AMENDMENTS PASSED, CUTS TAXES FOR SECOND YEAR IN A ROW** The Supervisors proposed Town Budget for 2020 has been approved by unanimous vote of the Town Board. The 2020 Budget cuts the Town tax rate and reduces the overall Town tax levy for the second consecutive year. Over the two years, the Town tax rate has been cut by over 8% while maintaining and improving Town services. Three amendments proposed to the 2020 Town Budget were also approved. The amendments include:

- an increase in starting salary for non-seasonal part-time employees as proposed by Councilman Kevin Beckford;
- funding to hire an archivist for the Town's historic archives as proposed by Supervisor Smith;
- funding for an event to recognize the 100th anniversary of the passage of the 19th Amendment to the Constitution (Women's Vote Centennial Celebration) as proposed by Councilwoman Stephanie Townsend.

PITTSFORD IN FIRST-EVER COLLABORATION WITH POLLUTION PREVENTION INSTITUTE

For the first time ever, the Pollution Prevention Institute (P2I), housed at the Golisano Institute for Sustainability at the Rochester Institute of Technology, is collaborating with a municipal government - the Town of Pittsford - to perform energy assessments of government facilities. This first-ever partnership is being underwritten entirely by a New York State Department of Environmental Conservation grant.

The Town of Pittsford team met with representatives from P2I last Friday (11/22), launching the threemonth assessment with tours of several Town buildings and a review of Town building energy consumption profiles. The Town seeks to identify and implement cost-effective measures that will reduce the municipal carbon footprint and provide energy cost savings to residents.

This important undertaking is truly a collaborative effort - many thanks to the team helping us to further our long-held commitment to a sustainable Pittsford: RIT Project Lead Marty Schooping, Town Public Works

Commissioner Paul Schenkel, Town DPW Executive Assistant Renee McQuillen, Genesee Finger Lakes Regional Planning Council Clean Energy Coordinator Haylee Ferrington, Town Councilman Matt O'Connor, and RIT staff engineers Matt Stevens and Allen Luccitti.

#### **SEASONAL PARKING RESTRICTIONS IN EFFECT THROUGH APRIL 1, 2020**

In order to facilitate snow removal, Town of Pittsford seasonal parking restrictions are in effect from November 15 (this Friday) through April 1, 2020. Parking of any vehicle on public roads - including state highways and on the shoulder of all roads - is prohibited each year from November 15 through April 1 in all areas within the Town and outside of the Village. During this time, please don't park on or along public roads outside of the Village. Please note violators may be ticketed or towed.

When the snow flies, we need roadsides clear of vehicles so our plows can get through. This is especially true in neighborhoods, where the streets are narrower. Vehicles parked along the roadside can hinder plows accessing your neighborhood. Please help us keep our streets safe and accessible!
