TOWN CLOSURES FOR MEMORIAL DAY HOLIDAY

All **Town of Pittsford offices and facilities** will be closed on Monday, May 31 in observance of the Memorial Day holiday. In addition, the **Pittsford Community Library** will be closed Saturday and Sunday, May 29 and 30. Town **brush and yard debris collection** will be delayed one day due to the holiday.



BRIEF MEMORIAL DAY CEREMONY TO BE HELD AT VETERANS MONUMENT

Out of concern for the health of their members and that of the public, the Pittsford American Legion Rayson-Miller Post 899 will hold a brief Memorial Day Ceremony on Monday, May 31 at 10:00am at the Veterans Monument, 22 N. Main Street; please note the location is different from past years. The ceremony will be videotaped and broadcast the following week on Pittsford's local cable TV-12 Channel 1303. There will not be a parade this year. While the decision was necessary in light of COVID-19 coronavirus health and safety protocols, we understand and share the disappointment this news brings. While our celebration may be different this year, our care and support is as strong as ever as we honor those who made the ultimate sacrifice in military service to our country.



REMEMBRANCE POPPIES TO HONOR THE FALLEN – VIRTUAL POPPY DRIVE

Memorial Day is this Monday, May 31; it is a time to remember the servicemen and women who lost their lives during war-time service. This year, continued COVID-19 health safety and social distancing protocols will limit the Pittsford American Legion Rayson-Miller Post 899 in-person Remembrance Poppy sales and donation canisters. To ensure their continued support of veterans in need, the members of Rayson-Miller Post

#899 are conducting a **virtual Remembrance Poppy Drive** via their Facebook page and website. Funds raised from the annual poppy sale go to benefit veterans who are disabled, homeless or in severe financial crisis due to circumstances beyond their control – 100% of the funds raised are used for these services; no funds are kept by the Rayson-Miller post.

Town Facility Access

Spiegel Pittsford Community Center: building is open 8:00am - 5:00pm Monday-Thursday, 8:00am - 6:00pm Friday, and 9:00am - 5:00pm Saturday. Senior "Grab N Go" meals will continue every Wednesday and Friday; pickup is at the bus loop behind the Community Center. Registration for low-risk activities and virtual programs begins in advance of each session. See Program Info & Registration link at www.townofpittsford.org/home-recreation. Programs will continue to open as we receive further guidance. Visitors and program participants are expected to observe appropriate COVID-19 physical distancing and face covering guidelines.

Pittsford Community Library: the Library is now open for limited hours and services; enter from the parking lot entrance. The Library also has many online resources, programs and activities for all ages to enjoy. For current Library hours, services, and other updates, visit the Library's update https://www.townofpittsford.org/home-library-covid19-info. The Book Drop return area is open; please only deposit returned books; for information on book sale donations visit www.pittsfordlibraryfriends.com. Regular due dates for all materials have resumed; check your receipt or your Library account for exact due dates. Low contact pickup of Library materials is available for Monroe County Library System cardholders. Patrons are expected to observe appropriate COVID-19 physical distancing and face covering guidelines.

Town Hall: residents are encouraged to handle business online and by mail, phone, email and the "drop slot" to the right of the front door and at the back door of Town Hall. Calls should be made to the department related to the inquiry. Town Hall is open at reduced capacity; appropriate physical distancing and mask use are required. Those entering Town Hall are expected to observe appropriate COVID-19 physical distancing

and face covering guidelines.

Town Clerk: all services of the Town Clerk are available online, by mail, phone and email; residents are encouraged to handle business via these methods if possible. Town Court: Pittsford Town Court sessions are being scheduled on a limited basis. Town Court staff are available via phone and email Monday - Friday from 9:00am - 5:00pm; call (585) 248-6238 or email at pthurber@townofpittsford.org. Visitors must follow appropriate health safety and social distancing requirements for Court appearances and Court Office visits.

All Town Playgrounds: residents may use Town playgrounds at their own risk, as it is not possible for the Town to keep equipment appropriately sanitized after every use. Those using Town playgrounds are expected to observe COVID-19 social distancing and hygiene protocols.

All Town Parks: all Town parks are open; all courts are open, all athletic fields are open to groups of 25 individuals or less, and all trails and walkways are accessible. Those using Town parks are expected to observe COVID-19 social distancing and hygiene protocols.

Thornell Farm Park: the park is open and per State requirements, all grass and turf sports fields are open to group activities of 25 individuals or less; the tennis courts, trails, walkways and the playground are open to residents. COVID-19 social distancing and hygiene protocols are required.

King's Bend Park Lodges: the lodges are open for reservations; per State and Federal governments all COVID-19 safety guidelines must be followed while at the lodges. Lodge capacities will adhere to New York State COVID-19 guidelines. Please note COVID-19 social distancing and hygiene protocols are required.

The Mile Post School: the building is closed to the public until further notice, as the site is being used as a Public Works crew operation center.

Building Department: as of May 15, 2020 the Governor has begun the phased reopening of New York State. The Town of Pittsford and the surrounding Finger Lakes region have met the criteria set by the Governor to reopen. Construction is included in Phase 1 of the reopening plan. As construction moves forward, all COVID-19 safety guidelines set by the State and Federal governments must be followed while on the job site. To protect the community and limit the spread of COVID-19, the Town of Pittsford has altered accordingly its inspection and permitting procedures.
