The <u>Rotary Club of Pittsford</u>, in collaboration with the Town of Pittsford, will conduct its next drive-through canned and packaged food drive to benefit the <u>Pittsford Food Cupboard</u> this Saturday, June 5 from 9:00am to noon at Spiegel Pittsford Community Center.



The drive also will support <u>Willow Domestic Violence Center</u>, which works to prevent domestic abuse and ensures the services and supports needed to gain a safe and empowered life, and <u>Joseph's Place Food Pantry</u>, which provides food and fellowship to addresses hunger and food insecurity for individuals and families living in northwest Rochester.

The **specific needs for Willow Domestic Violence Center include** personal care items such as shampoo and conditioner, toothbrushes and paste, Black hair products, deodorant, razors and feminine hygiene products. **Needs for Joseph's Place Food Pantry** include pasta and sauce, peanut butter, tuna fish, etc.

GREENPRINT 25 – FOCUS ON MARK GREENE & HOPKINS FARM

This year marks the 25th anniversary of our "Greenprint for Pittsford's Future." A first-of-its-kind, award-winning program, the Greenprint preserved two-thirds of the then-remaining farmland in the Town – over 2,000 acres of open space in

Pittsford. One of the original farms preserved by the Greenprint was Hopkins Farm.



Congratulations to our Pittsford seniors!








LIBRARY CHILDREN'S BOOK SALE JUNE 12

Town Facility Access

Spiegel Pittsford Community Center: building is open 8:00am - 5:00pm Monday-Thursday, 8:00am - 6:00pm Friday, and 9:00am - 5:00pm Saturday. Senior "Grab N Go" meals will continue every Wednesday and Friday; pickup is at the bus loop behind the Community Center. Registration for low-risk activities and virtual programs begins in advance of each session. See Program Info & Registration link at <u>www.townofpittsford.org/home-recreation</u>. Programs will continue to open as we receive further guidance. Visitors and program participants are expected to observe appropriate COVID-19 physical distancing and face covering guidelines.

Pittsford Community Library: the Library is now open for limited hours and services; enter from the parking lot entrance. The Library also has many online resources, programs and activities for all ages to enjoy. For current Library hours, services, resources, and other updates, visit the Library's update page at <u>https://www.townofpittsford.org/home-library-covid19-info</u>. The Book Drop return area is open; please only deposit returned books; for information on book sale donations visit <u>www.pittsfordlibraryfriends.com</u>. Regular due dates for all materials have resumed; check your receipt or your Library account for exact due dates. Low contact pickup of Library materials is available for Monroe County Library System cardholders. Patrons are expected to observe appropriate COVID-19 physical distancing and face covering guidelines.

Town Hall: residents are encouraged to handle business online and by mail, phone, email and the "drop slot" to the right of the front door and at the back door of Town Hall. Calls should be made to the department related to the inquiry. Town Hall is open at reduced capacity; appropriate physical distancing and mask use are required. Those entering Town Hall are expected to observe appropriate COVID-19 physical distancing and face covering guidelines.

Town Clerk: all services of the Town Clerk are available online, by mail, phone and email; residents are encouraged to handle business via these methods if possible. Town Court: Pittsford Town Court sessions are being scheduled on a limited basis. Town Court staff are available via phone and email Monday - Friday from 9:00am -5:00pm; call (585) 248-6238 or email at <u>pthurber@townofpittsford.org</u>. Visitors must follow appropriate health safety and social distancing requirements for Court appearances and Court Office visits. **All Town Playgrounds:** residents may use Town playgrounds at their own risk, as it is not possible for the Town to keep equipment appropriately sanitized after every use. Those using Town playgrounds are expected to observe COVID-19 social distancing and hygiene protocols.

All Town Parks: all Town parks are open; all courts are open, all athletic fields are open to groups of 25 individuals or less, and all trails and walkways are accessible. Those using Town parks are expected to observe COVID-19 social distancing and hygiene protocols.

Thornell Farm Park: the park is open and per State requirements, all grass and turf sports fields are open to group activities of 25 individuals or less; the tennis courts, trails, walkways and the playground are open to residents. COVID-19 social distancing and hygiene protocols are required.

King's Bend Park Lodges: the lodges are open for reservations; per State and Federal governments all COVID-19 safety guidelines must be followed while at the lodges. Lodge capacities will adhere to New York State COVID-19 guidelines. Please note COVID-19 social distancing and hygiene protocols are required.

The Mile Post School: the building is closed to the public until further notice, as the site is being used as a Public Works crew operation center.

Building Department: as of May 15, 2020 the Governor has begun the phased reopening of New York State. The Town of Pittsford and the surrounding Finger Lakes region have met the criteria set by the Governor to reopen. Construction is included in Phase 1 of the reopening plan. As construction moves forward, all COVID-19 safety guidelines set by the State and Federal governments must be followed while on the job site. To protect the community and limit the spread of COVID-19, the Town of Pittsford has altered accordingly its inspection and permitting procedures.
