

CANAL TREE CUTTING PUBLIC COMMENT DEADLINE IS THIS FRIDAY, 10/15

Save our Canal Trees – Make Your Voice Heard
The New York Power Authority (NYPA) and the NY Canal
Corporation – the State agencies which oversee the Erie
Canal – presented plans to clearcut trees along the
Canal. The Town of Pittsford has led the way to oppose
this action. The deadline is this Friday, October 15 to

provide comments regarding the <u>Canal Corp/Power Authority Draft Environmental</u> <u>Impact Statement and proposed Embankment Maintenance Guidebook</u> and plans for clearcutting trees along the canal.

You can read here the <u>Town of Pittsford's comments on the Power Authority's Draft Environmental Impact Statement</u> and Draft Embankment Maintenance Guidebook, which summarizes the Town's position.

If you have not already done so, please make your voice heard. You can submit your comments to NYSCC-Embankments@bergmannpc.com in response to the Power Authority's Environmental Impact Statement, which outlines its rationale for clearcutting trees along the canal, and to its proposed Embankment Maintenance Guidebook.

You may also mail written comments to James Candiloro of the Power Authority at 30 South Pearl St. Albany, NY 12207. Comments must be submitted to the Power Authority by October 15, 2021.

FALL LEAF PICK UP BEGINS OCTOBER 18 Separate collection schedules for leaves and yard debris

Fall leaf collection season is almost upon us! See below for details about our leaf and yard debris collection schedule for the remainder of this year. Please remember to keep brush, branches and other yard debris

separate from leaves and place piles at the road edge, behind the curb.

LEAF COLLECTION

Beginning October 18, our crews will be in your neighborhood approximately every three weeks to remove **leaf piles** at the edge of roadways.

BAGGED/CONTAINERIZED YARD DEBRIS

Weekly collection of yard debris in paper bags and reusable containers continues through December 10. After December 10 these items, as well as loose yard debris, will be picked up as needed but not on a set schedule.

LOOSE YARD DEBRIS

Loose yard debris currently is still being picked up but not on a set schedule.

SENIORS FALL PICNIC AT KING'S BEND PARK IS OCTOBER 26


Reservation deadline is this Tuesday, 10/19

GREENPRINT 25 SPOTLIGHT: KNICKERBOCKER FARMS

about 500 acres in the Town.

The <u>Town's Greenprint plan</u> preserved three farms in the Knickerbocker family and a fourth that was later purchased by a family member. The J. Monroe Knickerbocker Farm has been farmed by the family since the mid-1800s and is currently owned by J. Monroe's son, Larry Knickerbocker. Larry farms with

already eagerly helping out with farm chores.



his son Whitney. Larry's young grandsons are the 8th generation on the farm and are

Overlooking the Irondequoit Valley, the 113-acre farm straddles both sides of Knickerbocker Road. Larry works the main farm, his personal farmland on Mendon Center Road, some leased acreage, and the Manno Farm on Willard/Mendon Center Roads, which he was able to purchase by participating in the Greenprint. The 226-acre Mano Farm had been preserved through the Greenprint as well. All together he farms

"I bought the Manno Farm with the proceeds from selling the development rights to my farm." says Larry. "And I would never have been able to match the price developers were willing to pay for that farmland without the Greenprint." At the time, land was becoming more and more scarce. "There wasn't enough land to work. Some farmers were forced out," Larry says. He's thankful the Town Greenprint saved so much land from development. "Now there's enough land to keep farming here."

Knickerbocker Farm's main crops are corn, wheat, kidney beans, hay and straw. Their farm stand at 164 Knickerbocker Road offers a bit of everything, all home-grown: sweet corn, tomatoes, squash, peaches, eggs and more, plus pumpkins and cornstalks in the fall.

The H. Harlan Knickerbocker Farm has been owned by members of the Knickerbocker family since the Civil War era. It comprises more than 100 acres of highly-productive land. H. Harlan's grandsons Rob and Alex Menzie currently own the farm, in addition to their farm in Lima, NY. The Menzies lease the farm to Bill Willard of Willard Farms for farming.

COVID-19 Closure Updates

On June 15, 2021, Governor Cuomo announced that COVID-19 restrictions are lifted immediately as 70 percent of New Yorkers aged 18 or older have received the first dose of their COVID-19 vaccination series. The State's health guidance and New York Forward industry specific guidelines—including social gathering limits, capacity restrictions, social distancing, cleaning and disinfection, health screening, and contact information for tracing—are now optional for retail, food services, offices, gyms and fitness centers, amusement and family entertainment, hair salons, barber shops and personal care services, among other commercial settings.

On August 2, 2021, Monroe County was designated as a County with a "substantial" COVID infection. Consequently, the CDC now recommends that people, regardless of vaccination status, wear a mask indoors. This is a recommendation, not a mandate. The guidelines are unclear at this point, as is the situation. Neither the State, the County or the Town has imposed a mask *requirement* at this stage. pp

Unvaccinated individuals continue to be responsible for wearing masks, in accordance with federal CDC guidance. Consistent with the State's implementation of the recent CDC guidance, masks are still required for unvaccinated individuals.
