SUPERVISOR OPEN HOUSE THIS SATURDAY WITH BILL SMITH - FEBRUARY 12



THINK CONSERVATION – AND SPRING! – WITH THE COUNTY'S TREE, SHRUB AND PLANT PRE-ORDER PROGRAM

Order deadline is March 4

Winter is still here, but it's not too early to plan for your spring native planting project – and you can help conservation efforts in our area while you do!



The Monroe County Soil and Water (MCSW) Conservation District's annual Conservation Tree, Shrub, and Plant pre-order program is currently underway and offers a wide variety of evergreens, hardwood trees, shrubs, wildflowers, groundcovers, seed mixes, plant variety conservation packs, and even enhancement items like bluebird nesting boxes and bat roosting boxes! Proceeds from the annual sale will benefit the MCSW Conservation District's education and preservation programs.

The catalog offers great choices for suburban conservationists, including an Edible Fruit Shrub multi-pack – featuring two plants each of cold tolerant strawberry, raspberry, blackberry, and two varieties of blueberry – and a Wildlife Pack that includes shrubs and trees that provide ideal food and shelter for wildlife. Packages range in unit size and price, from a bundle of 10 spruces, pines or fir trees for as low as \$15, to bundles of 100 trees for as low as \$102.

Native species new to the program this year include White Cedar (Arborvitae), Paper Birch, American Cranberry, and Red Osier Dogwood – all showy, beautiful trees and shrubs that produce wildlife-attracting fruit and flowers and will provide quite the fall scenery with their stunning foliage.

Planting trees and shrubs is perhaps the most effective way for individuals to help keep our environment clean and green. In addition to providing shade, privacy, wildlife habitat, borders, windbreaks and snow fences, trees provide many environmental benefits not visible to the eye. They work as filters to help protect drinking water, clean the air of pollutants, help mitigate stormwater runoff and stabilize soil to prevent erosion, and reduce noise by acting as sound barriers. Trees can help cool your home in the summer, and break cold winds in the winter, helping to reduce energy use. They can even add value to your property.

Orders are due by March 4 and will be ready for pick up on April 21 - 22 at Monroe County's ecopark facility (10 Avion Drive, Rochester 14624). TOWN AND COUNTY 2022 PROPERTY TAX PAYMENTS DUE THURSDAY (2/10)

First installments also accepted on or before February 10 Due to the current COVID-19 pandemic situation we are **encouraging residents to make payments by mail or by the secure mail slots at Pittsford Town Hall** (at the back door or to the right of the front door), 11 South Main



Street. This is for your safety as well as the safety of our staff. We ask that any cash payments be exact change and that you call ahead for an appointment if possible.

In addition, first installment payments and full payments also may be made at Canandaigua National Bank, 18 State Street, through this Thursday, February 10 only. Payments also can be made online using Visa or MasterCard only; please note there is a 2.75% service charge for online payments. To pay online click here, which directs to the Monroe County Property Tax portal on the Monroe County website.

The interest-free Town and County property tax payment deadline is February 10; first installments are also accepted on or before February 10. The payment stub (see page 2 of your bill) must accompany payment. Please include a phone number on your check. Please be sure to read carefully all of the instructions and information written on the back of your bill. It is also strongly advised that you do NOT pay by electronic **check**, as these payments do not receive a U.S. postmark and may arrive late.

Please note: If you are paying your tax bill with an online bill pay (electronic banking) system through your bank, please be aware that your bank still generates and mails a paper check to the Town and it may take as long as two weeks or more to reach the Town offices. This type of mail does not receive a USPS postmark. Therefore, the Town can only consider your payment received on the date it is physically received in our office.



ELDERBERRY EXPRESS TRANSPORTATION SERVICES AVAILABLE

Full services available: medical, banking, salon appointments, grocery shopping, etc.

The Elderberry Express is a free transportation service for Pittsford residents, age 55 and older. Volunteer

drivers can transport seniors to and from medical appointments, banking activities, visits to friends and family, prescription pickups, hairdresser/barber appointments and grocery shopping. Elderberry Express also continues to offer rides to COVID vaccine appointments and other medical appointments, including imaging, physical therapy,

and labs. Please note all COVID-19 precautions will be followed; drivers and passengers will be required to wear a mask.

Transportation is available Monday – Friday, 9:00am – 3:00pm. Services must be scheduled at least two business days in advance to ensure driver availability; Monday appointments must be scheduled by the prior Thursday. Staff members will be in the office 10:00am – 12 noon Monday through Friday to take calls. To schedule, call 248-6237 during this time. If you must call after office hours, please leave your name, phone number, address, appointment date and time, and type of service requested (medical appointment, grocery store trip, etc.), and a staff member will return your call to confirm your transportation. The service is free, although donations are welcome!



COVID-19 Access Updates

1/31/22 Update: Governor's mask mandate extended to February 10, 2022. 12/13/21 Update: By order of NYS Governor Kathy Hochul, until January 15, 2022 the Town must require all persons entering Town buildings to be masked, regardless of vaccination status. This applies to all Town indoor facilities, including Town Hall, the Spiegel Pittsford Community Center, the Pittsford Community Library, Town Court and the Highway Department, Sewer Department and Parks Department offices.

On June 15, 2021, Governor Cuomo announced that COVID-19 restrictions are lifted immediately as 70 percent of New Yorkers aged 18 or older have received the first dose of their COVID-19 vaccination series. The State's health guidance and New York Forward industry specific guidelines—including social gathering limits, capacity restrictions, social distancing, cleaning and disinfection, health screening, and contact information for tracing—are now optional for retail, food services, offices, gyms and fitness centers, amusement and family entertainment, hair salons, barber shops and personal care services, among other commercial settings.

On August 2, 2021, Monroe County was designated as a County with a "substantial" COVID infection. Consequently, the CDC now recommends that people, regardless of vaccination status, wear a mask indoors. This is a recommendation, not a mandate. The guidelines are unclear at this point, as is the situation. Neither the State, the County or the Town has imposed a mask *requirement* at this stage.

Unvaccinated individuals continue to be responsible for wearing masks, in accordance with federal CDC guidance. Consistent with the State's implementation of the recent CDC guidance, masks are still required for unvaccinated individuals.
