ENSURING THE EFFICIENCY AND SECURITY OF TOWN TECHNOLOGY NEEDS

At our most recent Town Board meeting, our IT Director Joy Brown presented proposals for a range of necessary upgrades and tools to enhance the security and



efficiency of our IT infrastructure, processes and resources. The proposed items impact IT hardware, software, training and security, including moving some Town systems to the Cloud for improved performance, access and security. The Town Board approved all of the projects and improvements. They are listed below, but for more detail, please see the IT Department's proposal at www.townofpittsford.org/files/images/ARPA-funds-proposal-IT-Dept-2022.pdf.

Information Technology Improvements funded via ARPA:

- Technology consulting services, which include IT security threats and compliance assessment, cybersecurity vulnerability assessment, an IT Security Audit, a PCI Compliance audit for credit card transactions, and a Technology Policy consulting review
- Purchase of a Security Information and Event Management (SEIM) system to provide ongoing automated IT security analysis (identifying potential ransomware infections, etc.)
- Cloud migration and upgrade of the Town's Docuware document and workflow management software and of the Town's KVS financial software. Cloud migration offers improved data security and a more robust backup solution. The increased flexibility in access it offers also means data can be accessed in times of crisis especially if on-site access is not possible. It does away with manual updates and the required downtime.
- Backup Server purchase with replication to the Cloud, which offers faster and more frequent backups, resulting in near continuous protection of key servers
- Apple products purchase for the Library including Mac computers and MacBooks with software which allow expanded access for educational and creative use
- Interactive Display for Town Hall meeting room for improved and upgraded presentation materials display
- **Technology Training** to meet required and necessary staff training needs through the end of 2024

The cost of these improvements is \$147,200. All of it is payable from the \$2.8 million in ARPA funds the Town has received from the federal government. Meant to mitigate the adverse effects of the COVID-19 pandemic sustained by local government, ARPA funds allow municipalities to recoup revenue losses, to complete deferred projects, programs and maintenance and pursue other projects related to municipal services. As we did with these IT improvements and the previously approved Library and Parks improvements, we'll continue to post publicly future initiatives of Town departments that contemplate use of ARPA funds – you'll find them with our Town Board materials for each meeting where they will be discussed. This permits Pittsford residents to comment on the proposals both in person at the meeting or, if you like, by written comments to <u>comments@townofpittsford.org</u>. The Town Board meeting agenda is posted on our minutes and agendas web page at least two days prior to the meeting.




TOWN FACILITY HOURS FOR GOOD FRIDAY & EASTER HOLIDAYS

The Town of Pittsford's annual Rabies Vaccine Free Clinic will be a drive-through event held on Thursday, May 12 from 4:30 - 7:30pm at the Town Highway Garage, 60 Golf Avenue. Update your pet's rabies vaccine for free - dogs, cats and ferrets are welcome! Although cats do not need to be licensed, NYS law does require they be rabies vaccinated. For safety, all dogs must be on a short leash; cats and ferrets must be in a secure carrier.

Three-year and one-year vaccines are available. A threeyear vaccine will be available to those who present a prior rabies certificate; all others may receive a one-year vaccine. Advance registration is not required; please call

COVID-19 Access Updates

3/2/22 Update: the Statewide mask mandate for schools expired 3/1, mask use is now optional in Pittsford School District schools; for more information, visit

www.pittsfordschools.org/COVID-19INFORMATION. The mandate remains in place for health care facilities, transportation and other related entities.

2/10/22 Update: the Statewide mask mandate has has expired for indoor public spaces including grocery stores, shops and offices. The mandate remains for other settings such as health care facilities and schools.

1/31/22 Update: the Governor's mask mandate extended to February 10, 2022. 12/13/21 Update: By order of NYS Governor Kathy Hochul, until January 15, 2022 the Town must require all persons entering Town buildings to be masked, regardless of vaccination status. This applies to all Town indoor facilities, including Town Hall, the Spiegel Pittsford Community Center, the Pittsford Community Library, Town Court and the Highway Department, Sewer Department and Parks Department offices.

On June 15, 2021, Governor Cuomo announced that COVID-19 restrictions are lifted immediately as 70 percent of New Yorkers aged 18 or older have received the first dose of their COVID-19 vaccination series. The State's health guidance and New York Forward industry specific guidelines—including social gathering limits, capacity restrictions, social distancing, cleaning and disinfection, health screening, and contact information for tracing—are now optional for retail, food services, offices, gyms and fitness centers, amusement and family entertainment, hair salons, barber shops and personal care services, among other commercial settings.

On August 2, 2021, Monroe County was designated as a County with a "substantial" COVID infection. Consequently, the CDC now recommends that people, regardless of vaccination status, wear a mask indoors. This is a recommendation, not a mandate. The guidelines are unclear at this point, as is the situation. Neither the State, the County or the Town has imposed a mask *requirement* at this stage.

Unvaccinated individuals continue to be responsible for wearing masks, in accordance with federal CDC guidance. Consistent with the State's implementation of the recent CDC guidance, masks are still required for unvaccinated individuals.
