MEET THE SCHOOL BOARD CANDIDATES NIGHT – VIA YOUTUBE LIVESTREAM THURSDAY

The Pittsford Central PTSA will present an online "Meet the Candidates" forum tomorrow (Thursday, May 5) at 7:30pm during which Pittsford Central School District Board of Education candidates will answer questions via a moderator. The event will be livestreamed on YouTube. The forum will be conducted in the Barker Road Middle School McCluski Room with only the moderator, the candidates and the School District



technology crew in attendance to maintain the health and safety of the participants.

Four candidates are running for two open seats. The candidates are listed as they will

appear on the ballot per legal drawing order: Nancy Clifford Lewis, Dave Berk, Emily Kay and Tricia Gonzalez-Johnson.

The candidates will answer questions from the moderator and questions from the public that were submitted in advance of the May 1 deadline. The event will be livestreamed for the public to view online, with ASL interpretation (livestream via YouTube). Due to time constraints, not all questions submitted will be used and the moderator may combine questions of a similar topic.

BLOOD DRIVE AT THE LIBRARY THIS FRIDAY, MAY 6

The Town of Pittsford will host a Red Cross blood drive this Friday, May 6 from 10:00am — 3:00pm at the Pittsford Community Library in the Fisher Meeting Room. The Library is located at 24 State Street in the Village of Pittsford.

Donors can schedule an appointment by calling 1-800-RED CROSS (1-800-733-2767) or using this <u>online registration link</u>. Please schedule an appointment prior to your arrival to help ensure we can safely manage the flow of donors.

The Red Cross will be following all current COVID-19 guidelines during the blood drive. Donors can save time using the RapidPass registration process. Just visit www.redcrossblood.org/RapidPass on the day of your scheduled donation, read the information, answer the questions, then print or email yourself the pass.

Donating blood is a simple thing to do, but it can make a big difference in the lives of others. The complexities of COVID-19 mean your help is needed now more than ever. The Red Cross has the ability to move blood around the country to wherever, and whenever, it is needed most. All blood, platelet and plasma donations will be tested for COVID-19 antibodies as well. The test may indicate if the donor's immune system has produced antibodies to this coronavirus, regardless of whether they developed symptoms. This also will allow the Red Cross to identify COVID-19 convalescent plasma, which is being used by hospitals to help treat immunocompromised COVID-19 patients.

As we continue to navigate this pandemic, blood donations remain essential to the health of our communities. The Red Cross needs the ongoing support of blood donors and blood drive hosts to ensure blood products are available for patients battling disease and facing the unexpected. The <u>Rotary Club of Pittsford</u>, in collaboration with the Town of Pittsford, is holding this Saturday's May 7 drive-through canned and packaged food and donations drive at **Mendon High School (this month only)**, to coincide with the Rotary Bike Drop collection. Food and supplies donated will benefit the <u>Pittsford Food Cupboard</u> and <u>Mothers in Need of Others</u> (MINO). The Food Drive will take place from 9:00am – 12:00pm at the Pittsford Mendon High School parking lot (472 Mendon Road). The Bike Drop will take place from 9:00am – 2:00pm; see story above for Bike Drop details.

<u>Mothers In Need of Others</u> collects and distributes maternity and baby items and cleaning products to meet the urgent needs of families in crisis. Working with social service agencies and church outreach programs, they help serve Rochester area families most in need. They have a critical need for size 4 - 7 diapers, wipes, personal and feminine hygiene and cleaning products.

Specific items needed for the May 7 food drive include soap, shampoo, hygiene products, toothbrushes and toothpaste, deodorant, baby formula, diapers and wipes, cleaning supplies and other items needed for Mothers in Need of Others. Pittsford Food Cupboard needs a variety of canned and other packaged goods, including taco shells, collard greens, spinach, beets, olives, lima beans, mushrooms, pizza sauce, salsa, rice sides, spaghetti (long varieties), plain oatmeal, bread crumbs, canned tomatoes (crushed, stewed, pureed or whole), canned meats (Spam, hash, clams, mackerel, herring, oysters, anchovies), cleaning supplies, razors, women's hygiene products, and cat and dog food (dry). The Town of Pittsford's annual Rabies Vaccine Free Clinic will be a drive-through event held on Thursday, May 12 from 4:30 - 7:30pm at the Town Highway Garage, 60 Golf Avenue. Update your pet's rabies vaccine for free - dogs, cats and ferrets are welcome! Although cats do not need to be licensed, NYS law does require they be rabies vaccinated. For safety, all dogs must be on a short leash; cats and ferrets must be in a secure carrier.

Three-year and one-year vaccines are available. A three-year vaccine will be available to those who present a prior rabies certificate; all others may receive a one-year vaccine. Advance registration is not required; please call

COVID-19 Access Updates

3/2/22 Update: the Statewide mask mandate for schools expired 3/1, mask use is now optional in Pittsford School District schools; for more information, visit www.pittsfordschools.org/COVID-19INFORMATION. The mandate remains in place for health care facilities, transportation and other related entities.

2/10/22 Update: the Statewide mask mandate has has expired for indoor public spaces including grocery stores, shops and offices. The mandate remains for other settings such as health care facilities and schools.

1/31/22 Update: the Governor's mask mandate extended to February 10, 2022. 12/13/21 Update: By order of NYS Governor Kathy Hochul, until January 15, 2022 the Town must require all persons entering Town buildings to be masked, regardless of vaccination status. This applies to all Town indoor facilities, including Town Hall, the Spiegel Pittsford Community Center, the Pittsford Community Library, Town Court and the Highway Department, Sewer Department and Parks Department offices.

On June 15, 2021, Governor Cuomo announced that COVID-19 restrictions are lifted immediately as 70 percent of New Yorkers aged 18 or older have received the first dose of their COVID-19 vaccination series. The State's health guidance and New York Forward industry specific guidelines—including social gathering limits, capacity restrictions, social distancing, cleaning and disinfection, health screening, and contact information for tracing—are now optional for retail, food services, offices, gyms and fitness centers, amusement and family entertainment, hair salons, barber shops and personal care services, among other commercial settings.

On August 2, 2021, Monroe County was designated as a County with a "substantial" COVID infection. Consequently, the CDC now recommends that people, regardless of vaccination status, wear a mask indoors. This is a recommendation, not a mandate. The guidelines are unclear at this point, as is the situation. Neither the State, the County or the Town has imposed a mask *requirement* at this stage.

Unvaccinated individuals continue to be responsible for wearing masks, in accordance with federal CDC guidance. Consistent with the State's implementation of the recent CDC guidance, masks are still required for unvaccinated individuals.
