Lane, from 7:45am to 12:00pm. PLEASE NOTE: additional appointments for Household Hazardous Waste disposal are no longer available for this event.



Please note the following fees for e-recycling will be charged (cash only) for recycling televisions and computer monitors with CRT (tube) screens: Computer Monitor - \$10.00; CRT Television under 27" - \$20.00; CRT Television over 27" - \$40.00; Oversized (Console, Rear-Projection) CRT Televisions - \$50.00. Fee payments will be accepted in cash only.

KEEPING OUR SEWER SYSTEMS HIGHLY EFFICIENT AND RELIABLE

At our most recent Town Board meeting, our Sewer Department General Foreman Jim Peterson presented proposals for relining the 60+ year old sanitary sewer system in the Alpine neighborhood, pump station improvements to address capacity and reliability issues, replacing the Mile



Post School septic system, and needed repairs to the Sewer Department building. The Town Board approved all of the projects and improvements. They are listed below, but for more detail, please see the Sewer Department's proposal at

Sewer Department Improvements funded via ARPA:

- Alpine Neighborhood Sewer Relining
- Reitz Parkway Pump Station Generator Replacement
- Lehigh Pump Station Upgrades
- Sewer Garage Overhead Door Replacement
- Air Compressor Replacement
- Security Gate Replacement
- Miscellaneous Pump Station Improvements, including replacement pumps and back-up pumps purchases
- Pump Station Control Panel Upgrades
- Septic System for Mile Post School House

The cost of these improvements is \$498,200. All of it is payable from the \$2.8 million in ARPA funds the Town has received from the federal government. Meant to mitigate

the adverse effects of the COVID-19 pandemic sustained by local government, ARPA funds allow municipalities to recoup revenue losses, to complete deferred projects, programs and maintenance and pursue other projects related to municipal services.

As we did with these Sewer improvements and the previously approved Library, Parks and IT improvements, we'll continue to post publicly future initiatives of Town departments that contemplate use of ARPA funds – you'll find them with our Town Board materials for each meeting where they will be discussed. This permits Pittsford residents to comment on the proposals both in person at the meeting or, if you like, by written comments to <u>comments@townofpittsford.org</u>. The Town Board meeting agenda is posted on our minutes and agendas web page at least two days prior to the meeting.

SCHOOL BUDGET VOTE AND BOARD ELECTION IS THIS TUESDAY, MAY 17

The Pittsford Central School District 2022-2023 School Budget Vote and Board Election is this Tuesday, May 17 at Barker Road Middle School. For more information about the Budget Vote and Board Election, view the <u>budget</u>

<u>newsletter here</u>. The proposed budget is within the NYS Tax Cap and maintains and enhances programs and services. Four candidates are running for two open School Board seats.

In-person voting will take place at the Barker Road Middle School gymnasium from 7:00am – 9:00pm. Voter identification is required. Qualified voters must present identification and proof of residency (NYS driver's license, NYS non-driver identification card, utility bill, or voter registration card). A qualified voter must be a U.S. Citizen, resident of the Pittsford Central School District for at least 30 days prior to the election, and 18 years of age or older.

Please remember that COVID-19 protocols at the polling site may result in a line forming outside, however, the District will do its best to make the process as quick and efficient as possible. Please plan accordingly for weather in the event the gymnasium is at full capacity when you arrive. Peak voting hours are typically between 7:00 – 9:00am and 4:00 – 6:00pm. Voters are encouraged to arrive at off-peak times to avoid crowds and lines forming.

COVID-19 protocols will include three feet of social distancing and self-screening for COVID-19 symptoms.

HISTORIC PITTSFORD STUDENT SCHOLARSHIP DEADLINE IS THIS SUNDAY, 5/15

Historic Pittsford is seeking student applicants for its Jean France Historic Preservation Scholarship. A \$500 scholarship will be awarded to a student who is enrolled in, applying to, or accepted into a college program that may lead to a career related to historic preservation. College programs may include but are not limited to architecture, history, museum studies, landscape architecture, environmental studies, or other related field.

The scholarship award is open to a high school senior or college student who is:

- a Pittsford resident (attending any high school or college), OR
- a non-resident attending Pittsford Sutherland High School, Pittsford Mendon High School, or a college or university in Monroe County.

The Jean France Historic Preservation scholarship was established by Historic Pittsford in 2016 to honor Jean France, a founding member of Historic Pittsford. Mrs. France was a highly respected architectural historian, a vastly knowledgeable preservation consultant, and a tireless advocate for preserving the built environment. A former professor at the University of Rochester, she championed the importance of architectural preservation as a lecturer, researcher and author.

The scholarship honors Mrs. France's commitment to the growth, development and mission of Historic Pittsford and to the preservation of historic architectural and cultural resources in Pittsford. With this scholarship, Historic Pittsford hopes to advance the careers of students with demonstrated interest in historic preservation, thus perpetuating the work of Jean France and the mission upon which Historic Pittsford was founded.



ARBOR DAY TREE PLANTING - A COMMITMENT TO SUSTAINABILITY

Have you stopped by Great Embankment Park to see the sycamore tree we planted in celebration of Arbor Day this year? COVID-19 Access Updates

3/2/22 Update: the Statewide mask mandate for schools expired 3/1, mask use is now optional in Pittsford School District schools; for more information, visit

www.pittsfordschools.org/COVID-19INFORMATION. The mandate remains in place for health care facilities, transportation and other related entities.

2/10/22 Update: the Statewide mask mandate has has expired for indoor public spaces including grocery stores, shops and offices. The mandate remains for other settings such as health care facilities and schools.

1/31/22 Update: the Governor's mask mandate extended to February 10, 2022. 12/13/21 Update: By order of NYS Governor Kathy Hochul, until January 15, 2022 the Town must require all persons entering Town buildings to be masked, regardless of vaccination status. This applies to all Town indoor facilities, including Town Hall, the Spiegel Pittsford Community Center, the Pittsford Community Library, Town Court and the Highway Department, Sewer Department and Parks Department offices.

On June 15, 2021, Governor Cuomo announced that COVID-19 restrictions are lifted immediately as 70 percent of New Yorkers aged 18 or older have received the first dose of their COVID-19 vaccination series. The State's health guidance and New York Forward industry specific guidelines—including social gathering limits, capacity restrictions, social distancing, cleaning and disinfection, health screening, and contact information for tracing—are now optional for retail, food services, offices, gyms and fitness centers, amusement and family entertainment, hair salons, barber shops and personal care services, among other commercial settings.

On August 2, 2021, Monroe County was designated as a County with a "substantial" COVID infection. Consequently, the CDC now recommends that people, regardless of vaccination status, wear a mask indoors. This is a recommendation, not a mandate. The guidelines are unclear at this point, as is the situation. Neither the State, the County or the Town has imposed a mask *requirement* at this stage.

Unvaccinated individuals continue to be responsible for wearing masks, in accordance with federal CDC guidance. Consistent with the State's implementation of the recent CDC guidance, masks are still required for unvaccinated individuals.
