• Farrah Ritter motioned for approval of the March minutes. Lori Lusk seconded the motion. Motion carried with one abstention.

FRIENDS LIAISON REPORT

- Pam Burch reported that the Friends Board meeting was held in person last night in the Fletcher Room. Several participants attended remotely.
- The March book sale was a success earning \$8000 in revenue. Extra shelves that were offered for sale sold quickly and the Thursday afternoon start was well received. This year's revenue is on target at \$39,200 and the fiscal year closes May 31st. The next sale is Friday and Saturday, June 10th and 11th with a Children's Book Sale Sunday, June 12th.
- The redesign of the website is in process.
- Friends' anniversary celebration plans are underway.
- The fiscal audit was completed with no findings reported.
- Friends are considering collaboration opportunities to develop a new logo.
- An American Girl Doll raffle is planned.
- The annual meeting is coming up. Trustees are welcome to attend.

HIGH SCHOOL LIAISON REPORTS

- Mary Devine reported for Sutherland library. The library has a collegial circle to increase literacy and reading for all grades. Book title challenge policies and procedures are being updated to support collection changes. TALAT (Take a Look at Teaching) Club has begun to increase student awareness of opportunities in the field of education. AP exams will begin soon.
- Jisu Oh reported that Mendon High School closed for after school activities one day due to a water main break. The TALAT club is also active at Mendon. A student/faculty mixer is planned for an after school event at the library. The Black Student Union met with the Asian Culture Club to connect and open

conversation. Juniors are working on applications for National Honor Society. Senior memory books are underway.

- The Friends Wish List for 2022-2023 was discussed. Lori Lusk motioned for approval of the list as presented. Tracy Castleberry seconded the motion. Motion approved.
- 2022 Director and Trustee Goals were reviewed.
- The 2023 Holiday Schedule was presented. Paul Seidel moved to approve the schedule. Lori Lusk seconded the motion, which carried.
