PICNIC & PROGRAM: THE ERIE CANAL, THE EARLY YEARS - AUGUST 24

An Erie Canal: 200 Years in Pittsford program Join us on Wednesday, August 24 at King's Bend Park for a summer picnic and learn about the early history of the Erie Canal – including the King's Bend. Part of the original – and somewhat meandering! – route of the Erie



Canal, the King's Bend eventually became what is now King's Bend Park. Enjoy music by Pete Morrissey beginning at 5:00pm, a picnic dinner at 5:30pm (sandwich, chips, cookie and beverage), and a wonderfully informative presentation beginning at 6:00pm by Erie Canal scholar and historian Craig Williams.

View seldom-seen manuscripts from the New York State Archives from the first days of "Clinton's Ditch" – the less-than-complimentary phrase often used to describe the Erie Canal in those early days. Williams, retired senior historian at the New York State Museum, will provide an illustrated overview of how the people of New York State learned to survey, design, construct and operate the unparalleled engineering achievement. COVID-19 Access Updates

3/2/22 Update: the Statewide mask mandate for schools expired 3/1, mask use is now optional in Pittsford School District schools; for more information, visit

www.pittsfordschools.org/COVID-19INFORMATION. The mandate remains in place for health care facilities, transportation and other related entities.

2/10/22 Update: the Statewide mask mandate has has expired for indoor public spaces including grocery stores, shops and offices. The mandate remains for other settings such as health care facilities and schools.

1/31/22 Update: the Governor's mask mandate extended to February 10, 2022. 12/13/21 Update: By order of NYS Governor Kathy Hochul, until January 15, 2022 the Town must require all persons entering Town buildings to be masked, regardless of vaccination status. This applies to all Town indoor facilities, including Town Hall, the Spiegel Pittsford Community Center, the Pittsford Community Library, Town Court and the Highway Department, Sewer Department and Parks Department offices.

On June 15, 2021, Governor Cuomo announced that COVID-19 restrictions are lifted immediately as 70 percent of New Yorkers aged 18 or older have received the first dose of their COVID-19 vaccination series. The State's health guidance and New York Forward industry specific guidelines—including social gathering limits, capacity restrictions, social distancing, cleaning and disinfection, health screening, and contact information for tracing—are now optional for retail, food services, offices, gyms and fitness centers, amusement and family entertainment, hair salons, barber shops and personal care services, among other commercial settings.

On August 2, 2021, Monroe County was designated as a County with a "substantial" COVID infection. Consequently, the CDC now recommends that people, regardless of vaccination status, wear a mask indoors. This is a recommendation, not a mandate. The guidelines are unclear at this point, as is the situation. Neither the State, the County or the Town has imposed a mask *requirement* at this stage.

Unvaccinated individuals continue to be responsible for wearing masks, in accordance with federal CDC guidance. Consistent with the State's implementation of the recent CDC guidance, masks are still required for unvaccinated individuals.
