The Food Drive will take place from 9:00am – 2:00pm at the Pittsford Mendon High School parking lot (472 Mendon Road). The [Community Food Cupboard of Rochester](#) is a non-profit food cupboard dedicated to feeding hungry families and home-bound senior citizens in Northeast Rochester and Irondequoit. In addition to access by appointment, the Community Food Cupboard of Rochester provides emergency food assistance for those with an immediate need, and a monthly delivery service for medically referred individuals.

Specific items needed for the May 6 food drive include cleaning supplies, reusable grocery bags, any canned tomato products (diced, stewed, whole, pureed, crushed), plain oatmeal, rice sides, boxed white pasta (no whole grain, please), 100% juice, dry cat and dog food, beets, coconut milk, collard greens, spinach, olives, mushrooms, pizza sauce, jalapenos, and green chiles. The cupboard has no more room for corn or any kind of canned beans. The Pittsford Food Cupboard has no more room for corn or any kind of canned beans.

Rotarians, students from the Pittsford Interact Club and Town staff will be collecting items rain, snow or shine.

FREE DRIVE-THROUGH RABIES VACCINE CLINIC MAY 11

The Town of Pittsford's annual Rabies Vaccine Free Clinic will be a drive-through event held on Thursday, May 11 from 4:30 - 7:00pm at the Town Highway Garage, 60 Golf Avenue. Update your pet's rabies vaccine for free - dogs, cats and ferrets are welcome! Although cats do not need to be licensed, NYS law does require they be rabies

vaccinated. For safety, all dogs must be on a short leash; cats and ferrets must be in a secure carrier.

Three-year and one-year vaccines are available. A three-year vaccine will be available to those who present a prior rabies certificate; all others may receive a one-year vaccine. Advance registration is not required; please call Animal Control at 248-6240 with any questions. Many thanks to Dr. Larry Silberg from Doorbell Vet, who will be conducting our clinic this year. Our thanks also to the Monroe County Health Department for providing the free vaccines.

STUDENT APPLICATIONS DUE 5/15 FOR JEAN FRANCE PRESERVATION SCHOLARSHIP

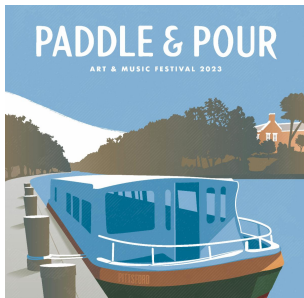

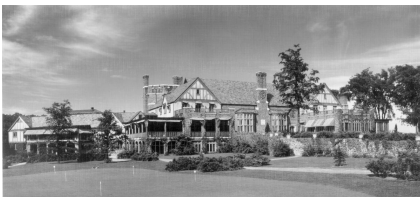

GUIDED HIKE MAY 6 FEATURES IRONDEQUOIT CREEK TRAILS

Pittsford Recreation's next guided trail hike is Saturday, May 6 – get outdoors and meet other hikers as you explore the Irondequoit Creek Trails! The Town of Pittsford's annual appointment-only Household Hazardous Waste (HHW) collection event will again be combined with our Electronics Recycling and Document Shredding program and held Saturday, May 13, in collaboration with the Town of Perinton at the Perinton Highway Garage, 100 Cobb's Lane, from 7:45am to 12:00pm. Up to 30 gallons of allowed HHW materials per appointment will be accepted at no charge.



Certified document shredding (residential only) will also be available at no charge. **To ensure safety and reduce waiting times, appointments are required for hazardous waste disposal;** an appointment is NOT necessary for electronics recycling and/or document shredding only. **HHW appointment scheduling is underway.** Pittsford and East Rochester residents can make an appointment by calling 248-6250, or by going online to <https://www2.monroecounty.gov/ecopark>. HHW appointments must be reserved by Friday, May 12 but please note **appointments may fill up well in advance of the event; early registration is encouraged.** Please note, waste from businesses will not be accepted.
