CELEBRATING THE NEW ERIE CANAL NATURE PRESERVE

We found a wonderful but chilly way to celebrate Earth Day on April 22 – with the official opening of The Town's new Erie Canal Nature Park and Preserve! If you couldn't join us, you can see our [photo gallery of the Nature Preserve ribbon cutting](#) here.

Encompassing natural wetlands, woodlands and meadows, our 20-acre Nature Preserve offers a creekside rest area, with overlooks of the frog ponds and meadows, and includes an elevated boardwalk trail allowing minimal-impact access to the wetlands. Its newly created trail connects the Canal Towpath with the Auburn Trail. The Preserve is part of 30 contiguous acres of natural habitat permanently preserved by the Town and Village.



Town Supervisor Bill Smith was joined by Deputy Town Supervisor Kate Bohne Munzinger, Town Board members Stephanie Townsend and Cathy Koshykar, Parks & Recreation Advisory Board Chair Rick Taylor, Environmental Board member James Pippin, Eagle Scout Paul Wazowicz, landscape architect and project designer Sue Steel, Parks Foreman Jess Neal and Commissioner of Public Works Paul Schenkel to cut the ribbon on the Preserve; residents, staff and volunteer board members were on hand to celebrate as well.

The benches throughout the park were designed by **Paul Wazowicz** for his Eagle Scout project - and he built the two benches located back by the frog ponds!

Plans are in the works for a native plants and pollinator garden at the Nature Preserve as well. Check the Town website and eNews for updates and in the meantime, stop by to enjoy the beauty of nature at the Erie Canal Nature Preserve!

ZONING CODE UPDATE: INPUT VIA ONLINE MAPPING TOOL EXTENDED TO 5/24

Public participation is critical to our Zoning Code Update – so we've extended the deadline for the online mapping tool to May 24 to ensure ample time for residents to use this easy and effective way to comment on Zoning changes.

Current pandemic protocols prevent traditional in-person workshops at this time but the **Interactive Mapping Tool on our Zoning Code Update website provides a virtual workshop that's open 24 hours a day, seven days a week**.

To offer additional time for comments from the public, access to the mapping tool has been extended through May 24.

FIRST AID FOR KIDS CLASS AT COMMUNITY CENTER THIS SATURDAY



PITTSFORD'S RABIES FREE DRIVE-THROUGH CLINIC IS THURSDAY, MAY 13 AT THE TOWN HIGHWAY GARAGE

This year the Town of Pittsford's annual Rabies Free Clinic will be a drive-through event held on Thursday, May 13 from 4:30 - 7:30pm at the Town Highway Garage, 60 Golf Avenue. Update your pet's rabies vaccine for free - dogs, cats and ferrets are welcome! Although cats do not need to be licensed, NYS law does require they be rabies vaccinated. **For safety, all dogs must be on a short leash; cats and ferrets must be in a secure carrier.**

Three-year and one-year vaccines are available. A three-year vaccine will be available to those who present a prior rabies certificate; all others may receive a one-year vaccine. Advance registration is not required; please call Animal Control at 248-6240 with any questions. Many thanks to Dr. Larry Silberg from Doorbell Vet, who will be conducting our clinic this year. Our thanks also to the Monroe County Health Department for providing the free vaccines.

Local students offer free COVID vaccine scheduling assistance

Two Pittsford students have created Students Promoting Access to Vaccines (SPAV), a program to help Pittsford seniors and others community members who may have difficulty scheduling COVID-19 vaccine appointments.

Cailey Huang, an 8th grader at Barker Road Middle School, and her sister Katherine, a senior at Pittsford Mendon High School, have created a customer-friendly free service to

make signing up for a COVID-19 vaccine easy and worry-free.

"Our goal is to make sure those in need or unable to navigate the technology are still able to sign up for vaccines" said Cailey.

Here's how the SPAV free vaccine scheduling assistance program works:

- Those in need of assistance with scheduling a COVID-19 vaccine can call (716) 320-1158 Wednesdays and Fridays between the hours of 3:00 - 5:00pm and Saturdays between 8:00 - 9:00am.
- The SPAV volunteer who answers the call searches for available appointments at the client's preferred time and location and books the appointment during the call, providing the client with all necessary information about the appointment.
- The SPAV volunteer makes an appointment reminder call to the client a few days before the appointment.

Only the client's name, phone number and appointment date/location is kept on file for follow up. Confidential information is not collected.

Right now it's just Cailey and Katherine taking the calls and making the appointments, but Cailey says they may consider recruiting more volunteers if there is enough community interest in the program.

Town Court: Pittsford Town Court sessions are being scheduled on a limited basis. Visitors must follow appropriate health safety and social distancing requirements for Court appearances and Court Office visits.

All Town Playgrounds: residents may use Town playgrounds at their own risk, as it is not possible for the Town to keep equipment appropriately sanitized after every use. Those using Town playgrounds are expected to observe COVID-19 social distancing and hygiene protocols.

All Town Parks: Farm View Park and Hopkins Park are closed as of November 2020 and will remain closed through the spring of 2021. All other Town parks remain open; all courts are open, all athletic fields are open to groups of 25 individuals or less, and all trails and walkways are accessible. Those using Town parks are expected to observe COVID-19 social distancing and hygiene protocols.

Thornell Farm Park: the park is open and per State requirements, all grass and turf sports fields are open to group activities of 25 individuals or less; the tennis courts, trails, walkways and the playground are open to residents. COVID-19 social distancing and hygiene protocols are required.

King's Bend Park Lodges: the lodges are open for reservations; per State and Federal governments all COVID-19 safety guidelines must be followed while at the lodges. Lodge capacities will adhere to New York State COVID-19 guidelines. Please note COVID-19 social distancing and hygiene protocols are required.

The Mile Post School: the building is closed to the public until further notice, as the site is being used as a Public Works crew operation center.

Building Department: As of May 15, 2020 the Governor has begun the phased reopening of New York State. The Town of Pittsford and the surrounding Finger Lakes region have met the criteria set by the Governor to reopen. Construction is included in Phase 1 of the reopening plan. As construction moves forward, all COVID-19 safety

guidelines set by the State and Federal governments must be followed while on the job site. To protect the community and limit the spread of COVID-19, the Town of Pittsford has altered accordingly its inspection and permitting procedures.
