TOWN LEAF COLLECTION IS UNDERWAY - PLEASE KEEP LEAVES OUT OF ROADWAYS

Separate collection schedules for leaves and yard debris

Our crews will be in your neighborhood approximately every two weeks to remove leaf piles at the edge of roadways. They'll be there once a week to remove yard debris in paper bags and reusable containers. Loose yard debris will be picked up as needed but not on a set schedule. Use our online Leaf Collection App to see when leaf crews will be in your area and our online Yard Debris Collection Map to determine your bagged/containerized yard debris collection day. To help us remove your leaves as quickly as possible, please:

- State and Town law both prohibit placing leaves and yard debris in the road and its shoulder.
 - Place leaf piles at the edge of the road but not in it. Leaves in the road are a hazard for pedestrians, bicyclists and drivers and can clog storm water drains, causing flooding.
- Separate all sticks, brush, yard clippings and other debris into reusable containers or paper bags. This allows recycling of all materials and helps avoid damage to our leaf vacuum or injury to our crew members. It also allows weekly pick up.
- From October 11 through December 6, sticks, brush and other debris must be placed in paper bags or reusable containers in order for Town crews to collect it on a weekly basis. This is because Town trucks that pick up loose debris in spring and summer are now busy collecting leaves and are fitted with different equipment. We'll still be picking up loose sticks and brush as needed, but please remember loose debris will be collected intermittently during leaf season.
- **Please don't pile leaves around fire hydrants.** Doing so delays firefighters in finding them when every second counts. Also, hydrants can be damaged by leaf pickup equipment when they are hidden under a pile of leaves; this can also injure Town employees and damage our equipment.

Please remember:

- Leaves will be picked up approximately every two weeks
- Yard debris *other than leaves* will be picked up every week if in a paper bag or reusable container
- Loose piles of yard debris other than leaves will be picked on an intermittent schedule during leaf season
- Regularly scheduled pickup for yard debris and leaves ends December 7 but the Town will continue to collect leaves and debris as needed

As noted above, make sure to place non-leaf debris in a paper bag or reusable container and keep it separate from your leaf piles.

KING'S BEND PARK LODGE 2020 RESERVATION REQUESTS START MONDAY FOR RESIDENTS

Pittsford residents interested in reserving a lodge at King's Bend Park for the 2020 season may submit requests (two per household) beginning this Monday, October 28 and through 12noon on Saturday, November 2, 2019. Request forms are available on the Town website facilities page or at the Spiegel Pittsford Community Center and may be dropped off or mailed to the Pittsford Recreation Department (35 Lincoln Avenue). Reservations for dates requested by multiple residents will be determined through a lottery (drawing of names) held on Monday, November 4, 2019 and those selected will be notified. Those selected

will have 10 business days after notification to submit payment and secure their reservation. The Town will notify those not selected and offer alternate dates for consideration.

After all initial requests have been awarded or resolved, forms from residents for additional reservations may be submitted and will be accepted through the month of December. Online requests cannot be taken nor awarded until after the lottery reservations are confirmed. Non-residents may apply for 2020 reservations beginning Thursday, January 2, 2020 after 12noon.
