The celebration begins at 6:00pm in the Pittsford Community Library parking lot and



PROTECTING POLLINATORS IN WINTER – LEAVE THE LEAVES!

Leaving leaves in your yard means more pollinators next year.

As part of the Town's ongoing commitment to supporting native pollinators in our community and expanding our pollinator corridors, we're glad to share some tips to help keep pollinators safe this winter.

Besides providing the native plants pollinators need and protecting them from pesticides, one of the most valuable things we can do to support

pollinators and other invertebrates is to provide them with the **winter cover** they need in the form of fall leaves and standing dead plant material.

The vast majority of butterflies and moths overwinter in the landscape as an egg, caterpillar, chrysalis, or adult and use fallen leaves and dead plants for winter cover.

Many caterpillars tuck themselves into a pile of leaves for protection from cold weather and predators. Fallen oak leaves become the first food for some caterpillars when they emerge. Bumble bees, now in steep decline, rely on fallen leaves to survive the winter in our area. At the end of the summer, mated queen bumblebees burrow an inch or two into the soil to hibernate for winter and need the leaves for protection from the elements. Fallen leaves provide food and shelter for butterflies, bees, moths, beetles, and more.

Are there places in your yard where you can leave the leaves this winter? Research has shown that lawns actually benefit from a thin layer of leaves. A thicker (2+ inches) layer for pollinator cover can be piled up around ornamental trees, shrubs and perennials to no ill effect. Leaving leaves in your garden beds protects your dormant plants and provides winter refuges for pollinators. Plus, fallen leaves build up heathy soil and have the same weed suppression and moisture retention properties as shredded wood mulch – and they're free!

If you must keep your lawn clear of leaves, try opting for raking or using a leaf vacuum to capture whole leaves, rather than shredding them with a mower, and make a leaf pile in a corner of your yard. If you do leave your leaves for the winter and decide you need to a cleanup in spring, do it late in the season so as not to destroy all the pollinators you've worked to protect over the winter.

ALL AGES LIBRARY BOOKMARK DESIGN COMPETITION DEADLINE IS THIS TUESDAY, 11/30



COVID-19 Closure Updates

On June 15, 2021, Governor Cuomo announced that COVID-19 restrictions are lifted immediately as 70 percent of New Yorkers aged 18 or older have received the first dose of their COVID-19 vaccination series. The State's health guidance and New York Forward industry specific guidelines—including social gathering limits, capacity restrictions, social distancing, cleaning and disinfection, health screening, and contact information for tracing—are now optional for retail, food services, offices, gyms and fitness centers, amusement and family entertainment, hair salons, barber shops and personal care services, among other commercial settings.

On August 2, 2021, Monroe County was designated as a County with a "substantial" COVID infection. Consequently, the CDC now recommends that people, regardless of vaccination status, wear a mask indoors. This is a recommendation, not a mandate. The guidelines are unclear at this point, as is the situation. Neither the State, the County or the Town has imposed a mask *requirement* at this stage.

Unvaccinated individuals continue to be responsible for wearing masks, in accordance with federal CDC guidance. Consistent with the State's implementation of the recent CDC guidance, masks are still required for unvaccinated individuals.
