

BLACK HISTORY MONTH: THE LIFE AND LEGACY OF COMPOSER DR. ROBERT NATHANIEL DETT - THIS THURSDAY

Discussion, with musical excerpts performed by Rochester Oratorio Society members

Join us at the Pittsford Community Library tomorrow (this Thursday, February 24) from 6:30 – 8:00pm for a special Black History Month program highlighting the life and legacy of composer Dr. Robert Nathaniel Dett.



Dr. Dett, an internationally-renowned composer,

choral conductor, author, human rights advocate and visionary, lived in Rochester for two decades, earned his master's degree at Eastman School of Music, directed choirs at Mt. Olivet Baptist Church and Trinity Presbyterian Church, and served as president of the local NAACP chapter. His rich and influential life and career as musician, educator, poet, and community organizer will be explored in this presentation and discussion by Arlene Wright Vanderlinde. Mona Seghatoleslami will moderate and members of the Rochester Oratorio Society will perform musical excerpts. The program will be held in the Fisher Meeting Room. It is free and open to the public; registration is not required.

The Town of Pittsford's Parks Department has openings for seasonal laborers and parks patrol. Duties for these positions include mowing, trimming, weeding, playing field preparation, trail work, and a variety of other tasks and require work outdoors in all weather conditions. Additional Parks Patrol duties include responsibilities



associated with lodge reservations including check-in and check-out, cleaning, minor repairs, and problem solving.

A seasonal gardener position also is open – this position provides grounds maintenance at the Pittsford Community Library, King's Bend Park, and neighboring parks, including planting, weeding, edging, watering, trimming, mulching and site cleanup.

Trees for Tribs' "Buffer in a Bag" program helps reforest waterways

The application period for the NYS Department of Environmental Conservation's Trees for Tribs' "Buffer in a Bag" Program is underway. The Buffer in a Bag program provides organizations and private landowners with free

tree and shrub seedlings to help establish or improve a stream buffer on their property. Qualifying private and public landowners may apply for a free bag of 25 seedlings for planting near streams, rivers, or lakes to help stabilize banks, protect water quality, and improve wildlife habitat.

Anyone who owns or manages land in New York State with at least 50 feet along a stream or waterbody is eligible to receive a bag of seedlings. Organizations or individuals with permission to plant on a given property with stream or waterbody access may also participate.

DEC's Trees for Tribs is a statewide program of the Colonel William F. Fox Memorial Saratoga Tree Nursery. Trees for Tribs has been working to reforest New York's

tributaries - small creeks and streams that flow into larger rivers and lakes. The program's goal is to plant trees and shrubs along streams to create a forested riparian (streamside) buffer that helps decrease erosion, reduce flooding damage, improve wildlife and stream habitat, and protect water quality.

Vegetation, such as trees, shrubs, and grasses along waterways creates a natural buffer that protects the water and provides many benefits. An established streamside buffer:

- slows down and filters run off, preventing pollutants from getting into the water,
- intercepts and slows water from heavy rains, reducing the instances of flooding,
- shades streams, creating cooler temperature conditions to support fish species such as trout,
- holds soil in place, preventing streambanks from eroding away during heavy rains,
- provides food and habitat for invertebrates, fish and other wildlife.

COVID-19 Access Updates

2/10/22 Update: Statewide mask mandate has has expired for indoor public spaces including grocery stores, shops and offices. The mandate remains for other settings such as health care facilities and schools.

1/31/22 Update: Governor's mask mandate extended to February 10, 2022. 12/13/21 Update: By order of NYS Governor Kathy Hochul, until January 15, 2022 the Town must require all persons entering Town buildings to be masked, regardless of vaccination status. This applies to all Town indoor facilities, including Town Hall, the Spiegel Pittsford Community Center, the Pittsford Community Library, Town Court and the Highway Department, Sewer Department and Parks Department offices.

On June 15, 2021, Governor Cuomo announced that COVID-19 restrictions are lifted immediately as 70 percent of New Yorkers aged 18 or older have received the first dose of their COVID-19 vaccination series. The State's health guidance and New York Forward industry specific guidelines—including social gathering limits, capacity

restrictions, social distancing, cleaning and disinfection, health screening, and contact information for tracing—are now optional for retail, food services, offices, gyms and fitness centers, amusement and family entertainment, hair salons, barber shops and personal care services, among other commercial settings.

On August 2, 2021, Monroe County was designated as a County with a "substantial" COVID infection. Consequently, the CDC now recommends that people, regardless of vaccination status, wear a mask indoors. This is a recommendation, not a mandate. The guidelines are unclear at this point, as is the situation. Neither the State, the County or the Town has imposed a mask *requirement* at this stage.

Unvaccinated individuals continue to be responsible for wearing masks, in accordance with federal CDC guidance. Consistent with the State's implementation of the recent CDC guidance, masks are still required for unvaccinated individuals.
