- The display case at the Childrens' entrance is available for families to share their personal collections and interests. It has been well received and is a fun family activity for all.
- Outreach at the canal starts Friday at the Erie Canal Park. Plans are to continue through the summer during the concert series. The MCLS Book Bike has been reserved for use as weather permits.
