



Town Volunteer Boards assist with the various functions of Town government and in many cases make decisions affecting key issues of importance to Pittsford's success as a community.

Interview questions will be consistent among candidates and responses rated against the same criteria. The highest-rated candidates will be selected; those not selected will be notified.

CHRISTMAS TREE RECYCLING UNDERWAY

You can be green even in the winter - recycle your Christmas tree! Town of Pittsford crews will pick up trees placed curbside as long as all plastic bagging and all decorations are removed. Christmas trees are picked up, weather permitting, through the end of January. Christmas trees also may be dropped off at the Highway Garage, 60 Golf Avenue, from 7:00am until dark, Monday through Saturday (call ahead

at 248-6270 if you'll arrive after 3:30pm weekdays or on a Saturday). All trees gathered will be chipped and reused as mulch. The mulch will be available in the spring free to residents in the spring at the East Street storage site located just before the gate to the Town Parks Department office building (enter at 34 East Street).

TOWN AND COUNTY 2023 PROPERTY TAX BILLS MAILED – DUE 2/10

Pittsford residents: if your property taxes are **not** in **escrow**, you should be receiving your 2023 Town and County tax bill in the mail this week. If **do not** receive your tax bill in the mail by January 10, you can obtain a copy of your bill by:



- 1. Downloading and printing a copy directly from the Monroe County website at https://www.monroecounty.gov/apps/propertyapp.php, OR
- 2. Emailing the Town Clerk/Tax Receiver at: townclerk@townofpittsford.org or calling the Town Tax Office at 585-248-6215 to have a copy of your tax bill emailed to you.

Residents may make payments in person, by mail or by the mail slots (at the back door or to the right of the front door) at Pittsford Town Hall, 11 South Main Street,

<u>online</u>, or at Canandaigua National Bank (18 State Street, Pittsford). We ask that any cash payments be exact change and that you call ahead for an appointment to ensure proper staffing is available.

The interest-free Town and County property tax payment deadline is February 10; first installments are also accepted on or before February 10. The payment stub (see page 2 of your bill) must accompany payment. Please include a phone number on your check. Please be sure to read carefully all of the instructions and information written on the back of your bill. It is also **strongly** advised that you do NOT pay by electronic check, as these payments do not receive a U.S. postmark and may arrive late.

Please note: If you are paying your tax bill with an online bill pay (electronic banking) system through your bank, please be aware that your bank still generates and mails a paper check to the Town and it may take as long as two weeks or more to reach the Town offices. This type of mail does not receive a USPS postmark. Therefore, the Town can only consider your payment received on the date it is physically received in our office.

REFUSE DISTRICT ENROLLMENT UNDERWAY THROUGH APRIL 30

In 2019 the Town enabled residents to create refuse districts for their neighborhoods. To date we have 24 neighborhood refuse districts in Pittsford. Creating a refuse district means potentially lower cost to residents for trash collection and reduces garbage truck traffic on residential streets in your neighborhood to one visit, once a week. Setting up a Refuse District and setting the boundaries of the district are

entirely up to the residents of a district - it is an optional program. The residents decide the boundaries of the district, then inform the Town of their decision. Our Town staff members guide interested residents through the process. January 1 - April 30, 2023 is the enrollment period for setting up a refuse district that will begin service in 2024. The hike begins at 8:30am. Participants will meet at the trail head and will be provided with a packet of maps and area information. PITTSFORD ROTARY FOOD DRIVE THIS SATURDAY, JANUARY 7



The next Pittsford Rotary Drive-Thru Food Drive is this Saturday, January 7, 9:00am - 12noon, at the Pittsford Sutherland High School bus loop (55 Sutherland Street). The drive is collecting canned and packaged food and personal items to benefit the Pittsford Food Cupboard, Nazareth College Oak Tree Food Pantry and the Community Resource Collaborative in Rochester.

The <u>Community Resource Collaborative</u> (CRC) works with people between the ages of 18 and 24 affected by violence, either directly or indirectly, including gun violence, domestic violence and trafficking. Through various collaborations across New York state and nationally, CRC connects young people to the resources needed to help them move through their traumas and obtain stable housing, employment, and mental health and other necessary services. A variety of food and personal hygiene items are needed.

The <u>Nazareth College Oak Tree Food Pantry</u> connects Nazareth's students, staff and faculty to outside resources based on a number of needs including housing, food, community centers and transportation. Specific needs for the Oak Tree Food Pantry include items that can be easily prepared by students.

A variety of canned and other packaged goods and personal items are needed for the Pittsford Food Cupboard, including plain oatmeal, beef stew, Manwich, 100% juice, taco shells, jalapenos, green chiles, tomato paste, olives, mushrooms and collard greens. PYS YOUTH AND PARENTING PROGRAMS BEGIN THIS SATURDAY, 1/7

Effective and Positive Parenting Program

Pittsford Youth Services is offering a free parenting group on Saturday mornings for six consecutive sessions from 9:00-10:00am beginning this Saturday, January 7 and

running through February 11. The group will learn about the *1-2-3 Magic* parenting program from Dr. Thomas Phelan. *1-2-3 Magic* is an effective, positive parenting program that divides parenting responsibilities into three parts: controlling negative behavior, encouraging good behavior and strengthening the child-parent relationship.



Youth Social Skills Group Program for 6th Graders

The PYS 6th grade social skills group will run for six consecutive sessions on Saturday mornings from 10:15-11:15, starting this Saturday, January 7, 2023 and continuing through February 11. The goal of the group is to teach social emotional skills to help children cope with every day triggers and stressors, and to reinforce resilience and positive behavior. The focus will be on self awareness, establishing and maintaining friendships, peer pressure and bullying, emotional regulation and frustration tolerance. The program will include conversations utilizing a variety of activities, in addition to art and music therapy.

Pittsford Town Board meetings are being streamed live; the feed is accessible on any device. Town Board is typically held the first and third Tuesday of the month at 6:00pm at Town Hall. See www.townofpittsford.org/calendar for meeting dates. To view the livestream, click the Town Board Meeting live streaming link when the meeting begins. This link can also be found on page two of the meeting agenda. The meeting agenda is posted on the Town's minutes and agendas page at least two days prior to the meeting. Please note: if you try to log in too early (before the meeting feed is live) you will see an error message; refresh your screen just prior to or at 6:00pm when the board meeting starts and you will be able to view the meeting. As always, ASL interpretation is provided for every Town Board meeting.

The Town of Pittsford has an American Sign Language interpreter available at every Pittsford Town Board meeting, to interpret for those who need this service.
