The drive is collecting canned and packaged food and personal items to benefit the Pittsford Food Cupboard, Nazareth College Oak Tree Food Pantry and the Cameron Community Outreach Center.




<u>Cameron Community</u> is an urban outreach community center in the Lyell-Otis Neighborhood. It provides basic food, clothing and youth program needs, as well as emergency services, to help individuals and families achieve self-sufficiency. Programs include free lunches, a Teen Center, after school programs, an emergency food pantry, and the Clothing House, which provides a wide range of children's and adult clothing, shoes, accessories, undergarments, socks, linens and small housewares. **Donated food and clothing items are welcome.**

The <u>Nazareth College Oak Tree Food Pantry</u> connects Nazareth's students, staff and faculty to outside resources based on a number of needs including housing, food,

community centers and transportation. Specific needs for the Oak Tree Food Pantry include items that can be easily prepared by students including soups, canned meats and vegetables, and sauces.

A variety of canned and other packaged goods and personal items are needed for the Pittsford Food Cupboard, including coconut milk, plain oatmeal, Manwich, soups, 100% juice, taco shells, jalapenos, green chiles, tomato paste, olives, mushrooms, pizza sauce, collard greens and spinach. REFUSE DISTRICT ENROLLMENT UNDERWAY THROUGH APRIL 30

The Town in 2019 enabled residents to create refuse districts for their neighborhoods. To date we have 24 neighborhood refuse districts in Pittsford. Creating a refuse district means potentially lower cost to residents for trash collection and reduces garbage truck traffic on residential streets in your neighborhood to one visit, once a week. GUIDED HIKE THIS SATURDAY, 3/4 FEATURES HISTORIC ERIE CANAL TRAILS

Pittsford Recreation's next guided trail hike is this Saturday, March 4 – get outdoors and meet other hikers as you explore the Historic Erie Canal Trails! The hike begins at 8:30am

and will last 1.5-2 hours. It encompasses the Auburn Trail and the Lock 62 Trail. History and points of interest discussed along the hike will include the Odenbach Shipyards, the Auburn Railroad, Lock 62, and the frog ponds of the Town's Erie Canal Nature Preserve. This approximately 4.5 mile hike is on a natural surface, primarily flat trail with some elevation gains

Participants will receive a packet of maps and area information. Bring your *Wegmans Hit the Trail Passport* and get credit for hiking the trail! The program is free but advance registration is required to receive the trail head meeting details. TAX BILL REDUCTION POSSIBLE FOR SENIORS WHO QUALIFY

Application filing deadline is TODAY, March 1

Those who will be 65 years of age or older by December 31, 2023 and have a 2021 gross income of less than \$58,400 may be eligible for an exemption which could reduce their future tax bills. The filing deadline for this tax exemption is TODAY. March 1

If you will be 65 years of age or older by December 31, 2023 and your 2021 gross income is less than \$58,400 you may be eligible for an exemption which could reduce your future tax bills.

If you think you may qualify, you can find the Partial Tax Exemption for Seniors form (RP-467) application with instructions on the Assessor's web page of the Town of Pittsford website at www.townofpittsford.org/assessor/exemption-information#SENIOR. If you have further questions, please contact the Town Assessor's at 248-6230 office by March 1, 2023.

Gross income includes your total salary and wages, total social security payments, total pension or retirement payments, interest, dividends, interest from estates or trusts,

disability payments, worker's compensation, earnings on IRAs, alimony, annuity payments representing a return on capital, and unemployment payments.

As always, ASL interpretation is provided for every Town Board meeting.

The Town of Pittsford has an American Sign Language interpreter available at every Pittsford Town Board meeting, to interpret for those who need this service.
