


# SUMMER FUN CAMP JOB APPLICATIONS DUE THIS FRIDAY, 3/31

## PITTSFORD ROTARY FOOD DRIVE THIS SATURDAY, 9AM – 12PM

The next Pittsford Rotary Drive-Thru Food Drive is tomorrow – Saturday, April 1 – from 9:00am - 12noon, at the Pittsford Sutherland High School bus loop (55 Sutherland Street). The drive is collecting canned and packaged food and personal items to benefit the Pittsford Food Cupboard, Nazareth College Oak Tree Food Pantry and The St. Andrew's Food Cupboard. Gently used recent issues (past 12 months) of

*magazines will also be collected* for distribution to various social agencies in the Rochester area.

The <u>St. Andrew's Food Cupboard</u> has been serving Rochester since 1980, providing assistance to families in the St. Andrews area by distributing food and personal items and providing referrals to needed services. They serve over 300 families a month. A variety of food and personal items are needed, including canned fruits, vegetables, sauces, meats and tuna; bread, soups, pasta, rice, cereal and oatmeal; muffin, cake and brownie mixes; salt and pepper, condiments, flour and sugar; toiletries, including bar soap, laundry soap, toothbrushes, toothpaste, body lotion and toilet paper; and baby food and diapers. The <u>Nazareth College Oak Tree Food Pantry</u> connects Nazareth's students, staff and faculty to outside resources based on a number of needs including housing, food, community centers and transportation. Specific needs for the Oak Tree Food Pantry include **items that can be easily prepared by students** including soups, canned meats and vegetables, and sauces.

A variety of canned and other packaged goods and personal items are needed for the <a href="Pittsford Food Cupboard">Pittsford Food Cupboard</a>, including canned fruit and vegetables, sliced bread, canned meats, coups, pasta, coconut milk, beets, pizza sauce, rice sides, olives, facial tissues, paper towels, 100% juice, and dry cat and dog food. ### BRUSH BURNING BAN IN EFFECT THROUGH MAY 14

New York State's annual Residential Brush Burning Ban is underway and runs through May 14. It's enforced to prevent wildfires and to



protect communities during heightened conditions for wildfires. When temperatures warm and the past fall's debris and leaves dry out, wildfires can start and spread easily, further fueled by winds and a lack of green vegetation. According to the State Department of Environmental Conservation, open burning is the single greatest cause of brushfires in the state. Please help protect our community and our Pittsford Fire Department firefighters who must respond to these fires — do not burn brush or yard debris during this time. A reminder: burning garbage or leaves is prohibited year-round in Pittsford.

Backyard fire pits and campfires less than three feet in height and four feet in length, width, or diameter are allowed. Small cooking fires are allowed. Only charcoal or dry, clean, untreated, or unpainted wood can be burned. Please remember to never leave these fires unattended and extinguish them after use. Be fire wise and help keep everyone safe!
