REMINDER – 2024 BUDGET HEARING IS THIS MONDAY, 11/6

The public hearing for Town Supervisor Bill Smith's proposed 2024 Town Budget will be held in the Town Hall meeting room this **Monday, November 6 at 6:00pm** during the Town Board meeting. Please note this Town Board meeting was scheduled for Monday to avoid conflict with Election Day.

The Supervisor's budget holds the Town tax rate flat – with **no increase to the tax rate**. It continues funding for all of the Town's services and events.



Willow also offers emergency shelter and other services. It's Monroe County's only licensed domestic violence shelter, whose compassionate staff help

PITTSFORD ROTARY FOOD DRIVE IS THIS SATURDAY, 11/4 FROM 9AM - NOON The next Rotary Club of Pittsford drive-thru food drive is Saturday, November 4, from 9:00am – 12:00pm, at the Pittsford Sutherland High School bus loop, 55

The drive is collecting canned and packaged food and personal items to benefit the <u>Pittsford Food Cupboard</u>, <u>Nazareth College Oak Tree Food Pantry</u> and the <u>Veterans</u> <u>Outreach Center</u>. See needs listed below. *Gently used recent issues (past 12 months) of magazines will also be collected* for distribution to various social agencies in the Rochester area.

The <u>Veterans Outreach Center</u> provides to veterans employment assistance and job training, health and wellness programs, veteran and family support programs, legal counseling, and a residential program, among other services. Specific needs for the Veteran's Outreach Center include winter hats and gloves, dog and cat food (dry and wet), full-sized shampoo and toothpaste, and canned fruits, vegetables, soups and beans, rice, pasta and peanut butter; find a complete list of needs here.

The <u>Nazareth College Oak Tree Food Pantry</u> connects Nazareth's students, staff and faculty to outside resources based on a number of needs including housing, food, community centers and transportation. **Specific needs** for the Oak Tree Food Pantry include **items that can be easily prepared by students**, including soups, canned meats and vegetables, and sauces. A variety of canned and other packaged goods and personal items are needed for the Pittsford Food Cupboard, including Thanksgiving-related donations such as stuffing, gravy, boxed potatoes, chicken broth, canned pumpkin, evaporated milk, and Frenchfried onions. Also needed are cereal, oatmeal, pancake mix, taco shells, jelly/jam, Spam, hash, sardines, beets, coconut milk, spinach, olives, refried beans, ketchup, salsa, canned pineapple and any condiments. The Pittsford Food Cupboard always welcomes hygiene-related items as well, such as kleenex, deodorant, body wash, razors, shampoo and conditioner; reusable grocery bags and paper bags also are needed.

Rotary Club food drives are scheduled for the first Saturday of the month through next spring at Sutherland High School. Additional information is available at <u>pittsfordrotaryclub.org</u>.


"FALL BEHIND" – TURN CLOCKS BACK THIS SUNDAY, 11/5 & CHECK YOUR SMOKE DETECTOR

Horizons is a division of the Eastman Community Music School, and the ensemble is comprised largely of senior citizens. This is a free concert, and everyone is welcome!


AMERICAN LEGION VETERANS DAY CEREMONY IS SATURDAY, NOVEMBER 11

GUIDED HIKE THIS SATURDAY FEATURES THORNELL FARM PARK


