Neighborhood Residential Zoning changes to be discussed; public participation needed

The Pittsford Town Board continues to conduct meetings to discuss the Town's Zoning Code Update. The next meeting will take place this **Thursday, May 30 at 6:00 in the lower-level meeting room at Pittsford Town Hall**, 11 South Main Street. The Board will discuss potential residential zoning changes that could affect every neighborhood. Public participation



is important! The meeting is open to the public and will be live streamed.

Pittsford residents and business owners may submit comments in advance via mail or email before or during the meeting either in person or via email. The meeting will be recorded and live streamed via the Town website. Trucks and more galore!





WE'RE CELEBRATING POLLINATOR WEEK JUNE 17 – 23!

Save the date for our Bird Harbor unveiling and Pollinator Celebration June 22 at Great Embankment Park

We've been working to support native pollinators, and we'll be celebrating our first-ever Pollinator Week June 17 - 23! In 2022 we partnered with community group Color Pittsford Green (CPG) to create a Bird Harbor – an area of native plantings for food and shelter – at Great Embankment Park. In September of 2023, in


continued collaboration with CPG, we launched the Pittsford Pollinator Pathway Challenge, a community-wide initiative to provide pollinator corridors of critical healthy habitat and food sources for butterflies, moths, bees and other pollinating insects and wildlife. Now, we're joining with Color Pittsford Green again to dedicate an entire week to the celebration of our pollinator pals! From garden tours to pollinator activities, and

a special ribbon cutting ceremony at Bird Harbor, it will be a week to remember!

The Little House, Historic Pittsford's headquarters and museum, will be open for visitors this **Saturday**, **June 1**, **from 9:00-12:00pm**. If you have never visited the 200-year old Little House, this is your chance! Located at **18 Monroe Avenue** next to Pittsford's Fire Station, the Little House is a historic gem in the heart of the Village of Pittsford. It serves as Historic Pittsford's office, has a resource room for historic research and exhibits of interest for all ages.

Stop by on June 1 to meet author Jack Butler. He will sign copies of the book he co-authored with Diane Ham – *Mendon Ponds: Fairchild's Dream.* It's a comprehensive account of the unique history, geology, flora and fauna of Monroe County's largest park. PITTSFORD ROTARY FOOD DRIVE THIS

SATURDAY, 9AM - 12PM

The Rotary Club of Pittsford's first drive-thru food drive of the new year is scheduled for this Saturday, June 1, from 9:00am-noon at the Pittsford Sutherland High School bus loop. In addition to the Pittsford Food Cupboard, donations will support Rochester's House of Mercy Food Pantry and the Nazareth University Oak Tree Food Pantry. *Gently used recent issues (past 12 months) of magazines will also be collected for*

distribution to various social agencies in the Rochester area.



The <u>Pittsford Food Cupboard</u> plays a crucial role in addressing food insecurity within our community. Donations help ensure that local families have access to essential food items that will promote well-being and stability. Food pantry items especially needed include Wegmans and Target Reusable bags, Spam, corned beeg, roast beef, clams, mackeral, oysters, sardines, ravioli, beef-a-roni, ketchup, chicken broth, rice sides, canned tomatoes (all varieties), dish, windex, all-purpose cleaner, toilet paper, body wash, shaving supplies and shampoo. At this time, they have no room for corn, tuna or any type of canned beans.

The <u>House of Mercy Food Pantry</u> serves those with food insecurity in the city of Rochester. Current needs include include baking (pancake batter, cornbread, cake/cookie mixes), canned vegetables (corn, peas, carrots, green beans, etc.) canned fruit (peaches, pears, pineapple, fruit cocktail) soup, condiments)mustard, mayo, ketchup, hot sauce), rice, pasta, hamburger and other Helpers, mac and cheese, stuffing mix, instant potatoes, scallop or au gratin boxes, peanut butter, jelly, beans (canned or dry, red, black, white, split peas, lentils), cereal (hot and cold, boxed, bagged, oatmeal, grits, etc.) and shelf stable prepared meals (SpaghettiOs, ravioli, stew, chili, etc.).

The House of Mercy also accepts socks, winter coats, hats, gloves, boots, toys, personal care items (blankets, towels, sheets, washcloths, razors, toothbrushes, toothpaste, shampoo and conditioner, tampons and sanitary napkins and clothes (socks, men's and women's underwear, bras, sweat pants, comfortable short and long-sleeved t-shirts for men).

<u>The Oak Tree Pantry</u> serves those with food insecurity in the Nazareth University community. Specific needs for the Oak Tree Food Pantry include items that can be easily prepared by students, including soups, canned meats and vegetables, and sauces. The pantry also needs granola bars, pasta, peanut butter, soap, and other hygiene products.

Message from Town Supervisor Bill Smith: EMT DAN O'CONNELL AND PITTSFORD VOLUNTEER AMBULANCE STAFF HONORED WITH PRESTIGIOUS REGIONAL AWARDS

Last week, the Monroe-Livingston Regional EMS Council held its annual awards ceremony, which takes place each May during EMS Week – a week where we honor and recognize the contributions of emergency medical professionals who dedicate their lives

to saving others. Two prestigious awards were given to the staff of the <u>Pittsford Volunteer Ambulance</u> organization.

EMT Dan O'Connell was awarded the Basic Life Support Provider of the Year for his outstanding contributions to the field of Emergency Medical Service as a Pittsford Volunteer Ambulance (PVA) EMT, a Ridge Road firefighter, and a Nurse at the University of Rochester at Strong Memorial Hospital. A seven-year member of the PVA, Dan was nominated by his peers for his dedication, responsibility, advocacy and insight into the EMS environment.

As an organization, the PVA won top honors as the Council's EMS Agency of the year for the second year in a row. The PVA is recognized as a Regional leader in EMS. Their incredibly high standards are revealed through their employee satisfaction, staff retention rates and their promotion of industry reform. These local heroes have set, and are committed to maintaining, the highest of standards for emergency medical services. I am incredibly proud of their efforts and thankful they are here in Pittsford, ready to serve our community with "skilled hands, cool heads and caring hearts." JUNE 1 IS NATIONAL TRAILS DAY

National Trails Day® is an annual event organized by the <u>American Hiking Society</u> that celebrates and promotes the importance of trails and outdoor recreation. Held on the first Saturday of June, it encourages people to explore, enjoy, and advocate



for the preservation of trails. To celebrate National Trails Day®, the American Hiking Society is encouraging hikers and cyclists to take the 2024 National Trails Day® Pledge, which states "in honor of #NationalTrailsDay, I'll leave the trails and the outdoor community better than I found them." How do you do that? Bring Ziplock bags for your trash and any other trash you come across. Stay on the designated trail and leave only footprints; take only pictures.

Pittsford has over 50 miles of trails and accessways to

enjoy. We've mapped out 10 suggested routes that utilize several of our trails and sidewalks, found right on our website's <u>Pittsford Trails and Walkways page</u>. We've also provided an <u>online interactive trails and sidewalks map</u> to help you plan your next hike.

Each month (in all seasons!) our Recreation Department offers <u>Guided Hikes</u> through various Pittsford trails. These hikes give you an opportunity to meet new people, get some exercise, and explore parts of Pittsford you may have bever seen! Your guide will also provide you with historical information and geographical background of the landscape. Our next guided hike is June 15 at Thornell Farm Park Trails.

When you're out on the trail, be sure to bring your <u>Wegmans Hit the Trail Passport</u>. After you've hiked or cycles six of the designated trails, you receive a free Wegmans reusable shopping bag and become eligible to win a \$250 Wegmans gift card! Program information and passports are available at the Spiegel Pittsford Community Center at 25 Lincoln Avenue and at the Wegmans Pittsford store at 2195 Monroe Avenue.


