

Pittsford's Juneteenth observance takes place this **Saturday, June 14**, beginning at **11:00am** at the **Pittsford Community Library**.



The **Underground Railroad Walking Tour** departs from the Library's Fisher Meeting Room at **11:15am**.

In the Fisher Room from **11:00** on there will be a video presentation, activities for adults and kids, including a "Create your own Juneteenth Flag" table, food and spaces for discourse on the meaning and significance of Juneteenth.

COPPER BEECH PARK DEDICATION IS JUNE 25

Our Copper Beech Park, located at 14 State Street in the heart of the Village, is still the Town's smallest park, but we've made some exciting changes! A beautiful, newly expanded area off North Main Street is connected by a walkway to the original Copper Beech Park on State Street. We'll be celebrating with a **ribbon-cutting ceremony** and a **food and music event** on **Wednesday, June 25, from 5:00pm to 7:00pm.**



The new Copper Beech Park area features a pergola for shade, as well as game tables and café tables. New lampposts complement the Village's traditional streetlamps. The plaza patio is screened with native plantings, and multiple garden areas with native shrubs, grasses, and flowering plants are located throughout the park. The new space carries on the legacy of our original, iconic copper beech tree. A tree cultivated from the original copper beech has been positioned in a place where it will thrive, providing enjoyment, shade and beauty for generations to come.

COMMUNITY RECYCLING EFFORT DIVERTS OVER 35 TONS FROM LANDFILLS

Our first-ever Spring Cleaning Recycling Drop on June 7 helped divert thousands of items – an estimated total of over 35 tons! – from the landfill. Together, our community recycled:

- **Electronics recycling** – 2.5 tractor trailer loads of computers and accessories, televisions, video and audio equipment, cables, wiring and more, totaling 12.5 tons


- **Scrap Metal recycling** – over 2.3 tons of steel, iron, copper, brass and aluminum items
- **Paint recycling** – three municipal dump trucks full of paint cans, approximately 14 tons
- **Clothing donations** – two medium-sized moving vans full, approximately 2 tons
- **Paper shredding** – secure shredding truck filled to the brim with nearly 4.5 tons of paper

The Spring Cleaning Drop was much more popular than we expected – an estimated 2,000 cars passed through to drop items off. Our team of 20 staff members from the Highway, Sewer and Parks departments and the Public Works office put in a long day and did an outstanding job unloading items for recycling and packing them up for transport.

Our experience this first time out will help us with logistical planning if we offer a similar event in the future. Many thanks to those of you who came out to recycle items and thanks as well for your patience and considerate cooperation while waiting in line. Your efforts disposed of unwanted items responsibly while helping to keep our community cleaner and greener!

ROAD CONSTRUCTION NOTICE: COUNTY ROADWORK SCHEDULED ALONG MARSH ROAD

The Monroe County Department of Transportation has advised us that roadwork (milling and paving) will begin **today, Wednesday, June 11, along Marsh Road** from the Canal bridge in Bushnell's Basin to Palmyra Road. If necessary, adjustments to the driveway will be made as part of this project. During this time, you may experience some minor inconveniences.



During the roadwork, please exercise extra caution while driving and stay alert to the following:

- Dust and loose stone on the road surface.
- Construction equipment working in the area.
- Low shoulders along the road.
- Temporary lane closures during construction.


PITTSFORD'S POLLINATOR CHALLENGE: NURTURING HEALTHY POLLINATOR HABITATS

June marks **National Pollinator Month**, a time dedicated to raising awareness about the critical role that bees, butterflies, birds, bats, and other creatures play in our ecosystems and food supply. These unsung heroes are responsible for pollinating over 75% of the world's flowering plants and approximately 35% of global food crops, making their health directly linked to our own well-being.

- Plant native.
- Provide food and water for pollinators.
- Avoid pesticides.
- Pick up your Pollinator Pathway sign at the Community Center.
- Display sign in your yard!

Launched in collaboration with the community group Color Pittsford Green, this initiative encourages residents to create connected corridors of healthy habitat and food sources for pollinators. Joining is easy! Here's how:

- Let us know which newly planted and existing native plants you have from our list (at least 10).
- Provide water and shelter for pollinators.
- Avoid using any pesticides.
- Submit your completed [submission form](#) at the Spiegel Community Center front desk, 25 Lincoln Ave.
- Pick up your Pittsford Pollinator Pathway sign at the Community Center when you drop off your form.
- Display your sign in your yard!

National Pollinator Month serves as a reminder of our connection to the natural world. By participating in initiatives like Pittsford's Pollinator Pathway Challenge and adopting pollinator-friendly practices in our backyards, we can collectively contribute to a healthier, more vibrant future for both pollinators and people.


Registration for Children, Teen, and Adult Summer Reading begins **June 16**; the last day to register is **August 2**. The final day to turn in your reading log is **August 29**.
