

EMBRACE THE RIDE: TIPS FOR SAFE CYCLING

Cycling offers a fantastic blend of exercise, eco-friendly transportation, and outdoor enjoyment for everyone, from little ones on tricycles to seasoned adult riders. From leisurely rides along scenic paths to invigorating commutes, the benefits of cycling—improved cardiovascular health, stronger muscles, reduced stress, and a smaller carbon footprint —far outweigh any inherent risks. By taking a few simple precautions, you can ensure your family's cycling experience is both safe and immensely rewarding.

Helmets: Your Family's Brain Protection

One of the most crucial elements of bicycle safety for both kids and adults is a **properly fitted helmet**. Helmets are designed to absorb impact and protect you in case of a fall, but they can only do their job if they fit correctly. Here's how to ensure everyone's helmet is providing optimal protection:

- Eyes, Ears, Mouth Method: The helmet should sit level on your head (or your child's head), covering the forehead without tilting backward. You should be able to see the front rim of the helmet when you look up. The straps should form a "V" shape just below your earlobes. Finally, when you open your mouth wide, you should feel the helmet pull down slightly on your head. If it doesn't, tighten the chin strap.
- Snug, Not Tight: The helmet should fit snugly all around the head, without significant gaps. It shouldn't move from side to side or front to back. Many helmets come with adjustable pads or a dial-fit system to help you achieve the ideal fit.
- Strap Check: The chin strap should be snug enough that you can fit only one or two fingers between the strap and your chin. If it's too loose, the helmet can shift during an impact; if it's too tight, it can be uncomfortable. For kids, always double-check their straps before each ride.

Beyond the Helmet: Safety for All Ages

Once helmets are properly fitted, keep these key safety tips in mind for every family cyclist:

Be Visible: Wear bright colors and reflective gear. All bikes require front and rear lights, even for daytime rides, as unexpected delays can happen.

Obey Traffic Laws: Cyclists have the same rights and are subject to the same laws as vehicles. Teach kids from an early age to follow all traffic signs and signals. Use hand signals, and adults should always model good behavior.

Stay Alert: Be aware of your surroundings, anticipate hazards, and make eye contact with drivers and pedestrians. Teach children to focus and avoid distractions.

Ride Predictably: Teach kids to ride in a straight line without sudden swerves. Adults should also ride predictably, clearly indicating their intentions.

Maintain Your Bike: Regularly check the brakes, tire pressure, and chains on all family bikes. A well-maintained bike is a safe bike.

Choose Safe Routes: For younger riders, stick to bike paths or quiet streets. Gradually introduce older, more skilled kids to more complex environments under supervision.

By following these proactive steps, you and your family can confidently enjoy all the incredible benefits cycling offers, riding responsibly and safely. So, gear up, embrace the open road, and pedal your way to a healthier, happier family!

Playground Safety Tips:

- An adult should always be present when children are using playground equipment.
- Choose age-appropriate playground equipment.
- Wear appropriate footwear.

PITTSFORD'S FIREWORKS REGULATIONS: WHAT YOU NEED TO KNOW

As summer approaches—the season most associated with fireworks—we would like to remind residents about the local regulations governing fireworks displays to ensure everyone's safety and enjoyment.

Permit Required for Fireworks Displays

Chapter 89 of the <u>Town of Pittsford Town</u> <u>Code</u> states that the discharge of fireworks within the corporate limits of the Town of Pittsford (outside of the Village of Pittsford) is prohibited unless a fireworks permit has been obtained.

Furthermore, the use of pyrotechnic devices in assembly occupancies (such as public gatherings or venues) also requires a specific operating permit, as outlined in <u>Article VI of Chapter 64</u> of the Town Code.

Who Issues Permits?

The **Town Clerk of the Town of Pittsford** has been designated as the permit authority for the issuance of fireworks permits in the Town (outside of the Village of Pittsford). This authority is granted by § 405.00 of the <u>Penal Law</u> of the State of New York. The Town of Pittsford Offers Courtesy Notifications for Upcoming Fireworks Events



As a courtesy, notifications for public and private fireworks events held within the Town

are posted on the <u>Town website</u>, the <u>Town Facebook page</u> and in the <u>Town's eNews</u>. The Town can mail courtesy notifications in advance to those in the immediate area of a permitted fireworks event (public or private) who request them. Monroe County and the Use of Sparkling Devices

Monroe County, New York, distinguishes itself from some other parts of the state by permitting the sale and use of "sparkling devices." Monroe County residents can legally purchase and use ground-based or handheld devices that produce colored sparks, flames, crackling, whistling, and smoke, provided these effects do not involve explosions or projectiles that launch into the air. Examples include cylindrical and cone-shaped fountains, as well as wood sparklers (but not metal wire ones).

Sales are restricted to designated periods around the Fourth of July and New Year's Eve, and purchases are only available to individuals 18 years of age or older. However, all other traditional consumer fireworks, such as firecrackers, bottle rockets, Roman candles, and any aerial devices, remain illegal throughout Monroe County, consistent with statewide prohibitions. Violating these laws can result in fines and criminal charges.

Here are key safety measures for handling sparkling devices:

- Outdoor Use Only: Always use sparkling devices outdoors in a clear, open area.
- Clear Surroundings: Ensure you are far away from people, buildings, dry vegetation, and any flammable materials.
- Water Nearby: Keep a bucket of water or a garden hose readily accessible for emergencies.
- **Proper Disposal of Duds:** Never attempt to relight a "dud" device. Instead, soak it thoroughly in water before disposal.
- Adult Supervision Required: Children should never handle sparkling devices, including sparklers. Adult supervision is always mandatory.
- Wear Eye Protection: Always wear eye protection when lighting or being near sparkling devices.
- Light One at a Time: Light only one sparkling device at a time.
- **Do Not Hold While Lighting:** Never hold a sparkling device in your hand while lighting it.

Prioritizing safety precautions can prevent serious injuries and ensure a safe and enjoyable experience for everyone.
