# SANTANA TRIBUTE CONCERT WITH EUROPA THIS FRIDAY





### HIKE THIS SATURDAY, 7/19, THROUGH CARTERSVILLE/SIMON STONE'S MILL TRAILS

Join us on a guided hike by our Recreation staff along the Cartersville/Simon Stone's Mill Trails. Get outdoors, meet fellow hikers and enjoy the natural beauty of our area! The hike begins promptly at 8:30am and will take place along a primarily flat,

natural surface trail with some elevation gains. Sneakers or hiking boots are recommended. We will walk at a brisk pace while discussing recreation opportunities, the Great Embankment, the Simon Stone mill, area ecology and more!

Be sure to dress appropriately for the weather and bring a water bottle. Our Recreation Department team will contact participants in advance with the meeting location and additional information before the scheduled hike date. Hikers will receive a trail map at the beginning of the hike. Bring your Wegmans Hit the Trail Passport



to get credit for hiking the trail! Extra passports will be on hand for anyone who doesn't yet have one.

The program is free, but registration is required. Register online on the <u>Town's Recreation page</u> or in person at the Spiegel Community Center, 35 Lincoln Avenue. NARCAN TRAINING & SERVICES INFO AT LIBRARY THIS MONDAY (7/21) - LEARN TO SAFELY STOP AN OPIOID OVERDOSE The Pittsford Community Library will offer free public Narcan training and opioid awareness information this Monday, July 21, from 12:00 - 3:00pm in the Library hallway. Stop by to receive a free Narcan training and a Narcan kit from the Monroe County Health Department.

Narcan (Naloxone) is a nasal spray that can be administered immediately to treat an opioid overdose.

The opioid crisis continues at an alarming level. Approximately every other day, someone in Monroe County dies from an opioid overdose. There is no community



immune to this crisis – learn how to save a life with Narcan. This drop-in program is free; no registration required.

# EMBRACE PLASTIC FREE JULY: SMALL CHANGES, BIG IMPACT!

It's Plastic Free July! Disposable plastics have become an everyday part of our modern lives. However, we are increasingly learning about the harm caused by these items, not only to our environment and the surrounding wildlife, but also to our own personal health.

The Plastic Free July challenge gives us all an opportunity to reflect on our plastic use and find ways to reduce the number of plastics in our lives, whether by choosing a reusable water bottle, ditching the plastic-coated detergent pods in favor of liquid or powder, replacing plastic snack and sandwich bags with reusable, nontoxic silicone, or skipping the plasticware that comes with takeout orders.

There are 31 days in July. Here are ten ways to reduce plastic waste. Can you think of 21 more? (This would be a TERRIFIC summer project to do with your kids!)

- Use Reusable Bags
- Ditch single-use water bottles and coffee cups! Invest in a quality, plastic-free, reusable water bottle and/or coffee mug.
- At the grocery store, opt for products packaged in paper, cardboard, or other materials instead of plastic.
- Use glass jars and containers instead of plastic for food storage.
- Say "no, thank you" when handed a plastic straw.
- Use a bamboo toothbrush instead of a plastic one.
- Recycle unused plastic toys instead of discarding them.
- When hosting a social gathering, use real plates and cups instead of plastic ones.
- When you go out for ice cream, choose a cone over a cup!
- When gardening, try to use old cans or cardboard egg cartons to start seeds instead of plastic pots.

Every small swap makes a difference, so let's make this Plastic Free July a stepping stone to a more sustainable future for everyone. Visit <a href="www.plasticfreejuly.org">www.plasticfreejuly.org</a> for more information.
