BE AN 'H2O' HERO THIS NATIONAL WATER QUALITY MONTH

August is National Water Quality Month, a great time to reflect on the importance of clean water right here in Pittsford. While the monthlong observance reminds us of the global and national challenges to water quality, it also emphasizes the importance of local action. The Town has reduced its own use of pesticides and synthetic chemicals to nearly nothing. On all of the more than 1,800 acres maintained by the Town, we use fewer chemicals, herbicides, and pesticides each year than just ONE house with a half-acre yard that uses a lawn service.



This careful planning greatly reduces chemical runoff into nearby waterways. You, too, can decrease pesticide use and help protect our water quality by joining the **Town's Toxic-Free Challenge!** Learn how to avoid synthetic chemicals while keeping your lawn beautiful by visiting www.townofpittsford.org/toxicfree.

The Town also follows a dedicated <u>Stormwater Management Program</u> to help prevent pollutants from entering local waterways that flow into Irondequoit Bay and Lake Ontario.

The Monroe County Water Authority (MCWA) provides our drinking water, which consistently meets or surpasses all New York State and federal drinking water standards. The MCWA sources its water from Hemlock and Canadice Lakes and adds water from Lake Ontario.

What you can do to help:

- **Properly Dispose of Waste:** Avoid flushing old medications or pouring chemicals like paint or motor oil down the drain. The Monroe County website offers an online tool that guides the disposal of specific types of waste. Find the "How Do I Recycle/Dispose of ..." feature at www.monroecounty.gov/ecopark-search.
- Be Mindful of Stormwater: Remember that anything that goes down a storm drain goes directly into our local waterways without being treated. Don't let car wash runoff, lawn chemicals or pet waste get into the storm sewer system.
- Conserve Water: Be conscious of your water usage at home to help reduce the demand on our local water resources.
- **Get Involved:** Consider taking part in local initiatives like the "H2O Hero" program through Monroe County. The <u>H2O Hero program</u> encourages residents to pledge to protect our waterways by adopting simple, everyday habits like picking up litter, properly disposing of pet waste and avoiding phosphorus fertilizers. By making this pledge, you're joining a community-wide effort to keep
