IT'S NATIONAL GARDEN MONTH! CELEBRATE BY PLANTING NATIVE

April is National Garden Month, a time to celebrate the joys and benefits of gardening. Beyond the simple pleasure of watching things grow, gardening offers numerous advantages for the environment.

Increasingly, gardeners understand the importance of planting native species.

Native plants provide balance to the ecosystem as they are adapted to local climates and soil conditions,

requiring less water and fewer fertilizers. They offer essential habitats and food sources for native pollinators, birds, and other wildlife. Additionally, native plants can help prevent soil erosion, improve water quality, and reduce the need for pesticides.

During National Garden Month, consider incorporating native plants into your garden. By doing so, you'll not only create a beautiful space but also contribute to a healthier and more sustainable environment.

Here are some **local resources** to help you get started with your native planting:

<u>Audobon New York</u>: Read a straightforward article about how to begin planning your native garden.

display in your yard!

TOWN OF PITTSFORD SEEKING CANDIDATE TO SERVE ON PLANNING BOARD – RESUMES ACCEPTED THROUGH THURSDAY, MAY 15

The Town of Pittsford is seeking applications from residents interested in serving on the Town's Planning Board, which currently has a vacancy. The Planning Board is comprised of seven volunteer members appointed to seven-year terms (no term limit) who meet on the 2nd and 4th Monday of each month at 6:30pm in the lower level of Town Hall. This legally constituted board is responsible for reviewing and approving or denying development applications in the Town.



Selection Process: Once we review candidates' resumes, we will distribute them equally among the Town Board members, who will then, along with the corresponding board chair, interview interested candidates. Interview questions will be consistent among candidates, and responses will be rated against the same criteria. The highest-rated candidate will be selected; those not selected will be notified.


TWO AUTHOR EVENTS THIS WEEK AT THE LIBRARY

It's **National Library Week**, and to help celebrate, the Library is holding TWO separate events as part of its ongoing Author Series! Both events are free and open to the public. Join us!

Tonight, author Jennifer Sanfilippo will discuss her book, *Our Last Walk Home*, which is an exploration of cancer treatment in the United States, from diagnosis to death, through the lens of a widow's grief. This very personal, often painful, and surprisingly funny narrative challenges the big



questions of mental health care for cancer patients and families, patient centeredness in teaching hospitals, and our nation's cultural refusal to engage in useful dialogue and practices around death and grief. The discussion will take place tonight from 6:00 to 7:00pm in the Library's Fisher Meeting Room.



Tomorrow night, April 10, join Dr. Andreas Daum, a history professor at SUNY Buffalo, who has written the first concise biography of Alexander von Humboldt, a Prussian nobleman born during the age of European enlightenment. Humboldt was a contemporary of Napoleon, Simón Bolívar, and Charles Darwin. Daum helps us understand him as a seminal historical figure and sheds light on the role of science at the dawn of the global world. Dr. Daum will be in the Library's Fisher Meeting Room to discuss Alexander Von Humboldt: A Concise Biography from 6:30 to 7:30pm.



WATER WAY OF CHANGE: WOMEN AND THE ERIE CANAL 4/17

Did you know the Erie Canal helped facilitate women's rights in the United States? Learn how on Thursday, April 17, from 2:00 to 3:00pm at a special Pittsford Community Library event to hear a presentation entitled "Water Way of Change: Women and the Erie Canal," which will explore how the fight for women's rights grew out of the changes brought about by the Erie Canal and the movement's dependence on networks that the Canal facilitates. This takes place in the Library's Fisher Meeting Room and is free



and open to the public; no registration is required.

The Erie Canal turns 200 this year! The above program is one of many planned to celebrate the Erie Canal Bicentennial. Although Pittsford was settled in 1792, its population expanded exponentially when the Erie Canal was completed in 1825. The canal directly linked agricultural goods from local farms to markets in New York City and other major cities along the East Coast and the Great Lakes Region. The Erie Canal had a significant economic impact on our region and transformed our area's social, cultural, political, and environmental landscapes.

AN INSIDE LOOK AT TOWN OPERATIONS: SEWER EXTENSIONS

A sewer extension refers to the addition or modification of existing sewer infrastructure. The purpose of a sewer extension is to provide wastewater treatment and disposal services to newly developed areas or those that previously relied on septic systems or other less centralized methods. An extension typically involves laying new sewer lines, including main sewers, lateral sewers, or trunk sewers, to connect the new area to the main sewer system.



Extending a sewer line is a complex process. State and local regulations govern all sewer work conducted within the Town of Pittsford. Each service request is site-specific and requires research regarding availability (location and flow of the nearest sewer line), extension, and entrance requirements. Property owners and developers can contact the Sewer Department for further information regarding sewer availability, entrance requirements, permits, inspections, and other sewer-related issues at (585) 248 - 6490 or via the Contact form on the Town of Pittsford website. The Sewer Department is located at 3899 Monroe Avenue.



ELDERBERRY EXPRESS TAKES SENIORS WHERE THEY NEED TO GO



Please note: if you try to log in too early (before the meeting feed is live) you will see an error message; refresh your screen just prior to or at 6:00pm when the board meeting starts and you will be able to view the meeting.
