A Message from Supervisor Bill Smith:

ANNUAL AUDIT REAFFIRMS PITTSFORD'S FISCAL STRENGTH

At its last meeting, the Town Board received the report of our independent auditors, Bonadio & Co., LLP, on its audit of the Town's finances and financial operations for 2024 and the Town's financial position at the end of the year.

I'm pleased to report that the audit found Pittsford Town government to be in a strong financial position. We actually improved our net position year over year as compared to 2023. The auditors noted the Town's strong financial controls, that assure accurate and honest reporting and financial management.



Our financial management of the Town government and our financial and reporting practices are central to day-to-day operations we oversee here at Town Hall. Although its one of the most important duties the Town staff and I undertake, it's probably the aspect of Town operations that by its nature may be the least visible. You can see us picking up leaves and paving streets. You don't see the tremendous amount of work and care every day that has made Pittsford so fiscally strong.

It's why we have a perfect Triple-A credit rating – unique in the country among towns of our size. It's why we have a perfect report card on fiscal stress from the State Comptroller. All a result of the stability we've enjoyed over time in our internal administrative structuring and the personnel we have in place.

Special thanks to Finance Department members Brian Luke and Dina Isgro for their work in keeping Pittsford at the top of our game.

Update your pet's rabies vaccine for free – dogs, cats, and ferrets are welcome! Although cats do not need to be licensed, NYS law requires rabies vaccination. For **safety, all dogs must be on a short leash** (even if they're inside a vehicle); **cats and ferrets must be in a secure carrier**.

Advance registration is not required; please call Animal Control at 248-6240 with any questions. Many thanks to Dr. Sam Kalis, DVM, who will conduct our clinic this year, and the Monroe County Health Department for providing the free vaccines.

NEW KEY CARD ACCESS SYSTEM NOW IN EFFECT AT PITTSFORD DOG PARK

In collaboration with Monroe County, the Town of Pittsford installed a new key card access system this past Monday, April 28. **Your key card now provides entry into the Pittsford Dog Park.** If you previously registered for our dog park and cannot find your key card, contact the Monroe County Parks Department at mcparks@monroecounty.gov or 753-7275 (PARK) for a replacement card.

Our Pittsford Dog Park features two off-leash areas, one for large dogs and the other for small dogs. Dogs can enjoy play structures while their owners relax on benches or picnic tables. From spring through fall, the park provides drinking fountains for thirsty pups and a dog washing station to clean off muddy paws. In line with the Town's commitment to walkability and bikeability, the park includes two entrances to the Town's Simon Stone's Mill trail.

As our Dog Park is part of the Monroe County Dog Park system, dogs must be registered with the County to participate. You can find registration information on the County website at www.monroecounty.gov/parks-DogParks.

The Pittsford Town Dog Park is located at 34 East Street and is open year-round from 7:00am until dusk.

For those in need, bikes often serve as the most affordable means of transportation to jobs, schools, churches, rehabilitation and training programs, and meals at local social service agencies.






