SPRING CLEANING RECYCLE DROP IS THIS SATURDAY, JUNE 7 – FREE FOR PITTSFORD RESIDENTS

Clean out your closets and garage without filling the landfill! To simplify disposing of items that can't be put in the trash, the Town has organized a Spring Cleaning Drop on Saturday, June 7, from 9:00 a.m. to noon



at Pittsford Mendon High School. It's free for Pittsford residents! Town staff will collect electronics, scrap metal, and paint for recycling. We also provide secure document shredding services. Volunteers from the Women's Club of Pittsford will collect clothing items and linens.

Electronics Recycling

Accepted items include: computers and computer accessories (keyboards, mice, etc.), laptops, mobile devices, printers, video, audio and stereo equipment, televisions, wiring, cables and *rechargeable batteries*

Not accepted: please do NOT bring small or

large appliances; we cannot accept toasters, vacuum cleaners, coffee makers, hair dryers, irons, stoves, refrigerators, air conditioners, washers, dryers, etc., or non-rechargeable batteries

Paint Recycling

- Paints, primers, stains, sealers and clear coatings such as shellac and varnish will be accepted
- Must be in the original container with original label, covered with a secure lid
- Please do NOT bring aerosol coatings/spray paint, solvents and industrial/nonarchitectural use paints

Scrap Metal Recycling

 Accepting various metal items made of steel, stainless steel, iron, cast iron, copper, brass, or aluminum – including siding and gutters, wires, pipes, electrical components, insulated wires, sheet metal and other items made of metal (no large appliances)

Certified Document Shredding

- Secure shredding, personal/residential documents only
- No need to remove staples or paper clips

Clothing Donations

- Used clothing, shoes, sneakers, belts, purses, linens, pillowcases, blankets and curtains will be accepted
- Through their partnership with St. Pauly Textile, the Women's Club of Pittsford will be paid for all clothing items and linens collected; these funds will support a variety of charitable efforts in Pittsford
- St. Pauly Textile ensures usable clothing gets to those who can use it locally, nationally and internationally
- Items that are no longer wearable/usable will be recycled




LIBRARY TO OPEN AT 12PM THIS FRIDAY

GUIDED HIKE THIS SATURDAY, 6/7, THROUGH ISAAC GORDON TRAILS

Celebrate National Trails Day this Saturday, June 7 with a guided hike from our Recreation staff. Get outdoors, meet fellow hikers and enjoy a short but invigorating hike through Isaac Gordon Nature Park! The hike begins promptly at 8:30am. It's slightly less than one mile long and will loop around the park, traversing mostly flat but occasionally uneven terrain (mud and grass) with some minor elevation gains. We'll walk at a brisk pace while discussing recreational opportunities, park information and more!



We recommend wearing comfortable walking or hiking shoes and bringing a water bottle. Be sure to dress appropriately for the weather. Our Recreation Department team will contact participants in advance with the meeting location and additional information before the scheduled hike date. Hikers will receive a trail map at the beginning of the hike. Bring your Wegmans Hit the Trail Passport to get credit for hiking the trail! Extra passports will be on hand for anyone who doesn't yet have one.

The program is free, but registration is required. Register online on the <u>Town's</u> Recreation page or in person at the Spiegel Community Center, 35 Lincoln Avenue. 

- Complete all eight trails and return your passport to the Community Center for a chance to win a Wegmans gift card.




interest and activity level. From the historic Erie Canalway Trail to peaceful woodland paths and picturesque park routes, our town is a haven for outdoor enthusiasts.

Maximize your blood donation and help more patients! If you are an eligible type O, B, or A donor, consider making a Power Red donation. Red blood cells are the most transfused blood component.

<u>blood/manage-my-donations/rapidpass</u> to complete your pre-donation reading and health history questions on the day of your appointment. Those who give blood between June 1 and 30 will receive a \$14 gift card by email.



NARCAN TRAINING & SERVICES INFO AT LIBRARY THIS SATURDAY - LEARN TO SAFELY STOP AN OPIOID OVERDOSE

The Pittsford Community Library will offer free public Narcan training and opioid awareness information this **Saturday**, **June 7**, from **11:00am to 2:00pm** in the **Library hallway**. Stop by to receive free Narcan training and a Narcan kit from the Monroe County Health Department. Narcan

(Naloxone) is a nasal spray that can be administered immediately to treat an opioid overdose.

The opioid crisis continues at an alarming level. Approximately every other day, someone in Monroe County dies from an opioid overdose. No community is immune to this crisis – learn how to save a life with Narcan. This drop-in program is free; no registration is required.

PITTSFORD ROTARY FOOD DRIVE THIS SATURDAY, 9AM – 12PM

The Rotary Club of Pittsford's next food drive is scheduled for this Saturday, June 7, from 9:00am-noon at the Pittsford Sutherland High School bus loop. In addition to the Pittsford Food Cupboard, donations will support the Willow Domestic Violence Center and the Nazareth University Oak Tree Food Pantry. Gently used recent issues (past 12 months) of magazines will also be collected for distribution to various social agencies in the Rochester area.

The <u>Pittsford Food Cupboard</u> plays a crucial role in addressing food insecurity within our community. Donations help ensure that local families have access to essential food items that will promote well-being and stability. Food pantry items especially needed include canned salmon, taco shells, spaghetti sauce, canned tomatoes (crushed, whole, or pureed – no diced), pudding, Jello and

sauce, canned tomatoes (crushed, whole, or pureed – no diced), pudding, Jello and jelly. They currently do not have room for corn, black beans, white beans, baked beans, or green beans.

The <u>Willow Domestic Violence Center</u> has been serving the Greater Rochester community for over 40 years, assisting more than 15,000 individuals in Monroe County each year. 


Saturday, June 14 – The Little House will be open to the public for Juneteenth events. Watch for details about activities in the Village that day.
