Reckless driving, speeding in particular, puts schoolchildren at risk. As we continue to make safety improvements on Town roads and with new sidewalks, I will continue to ask the State Department of Transportation for various traffic safety improvements that only it can approve.

Note especially that passing a stopped school bus with its stop sign deployed is a serious offense. It is uniquely dangerous. All children, kindergarten through 12th grade, deserve to arrive at their destinations free from harm. Your participation is crucial.

Drivers, please obey speed limits, especially in school zones. Watch for children crossing the streets and be extra cautious during bus pick-up and drop-off times. Parents, please remind your children about the importance of road safety and using crosswalks. Make sure young bicyclists wear helmets. Speak with your student drivers about safe driving practices. Remind them it takes mere seconds of distraction to ruin lives.


Within our schools, teachers and staff do their part in keeping kids safe. Together we can make it safe for Pittsford's schoolchildren outside of school. Let's work together to



SCHOOL TAX 2025-2026 INFORMATION

The 2025-2026 school tax bills have been mailed. If your bill has not arrived by Monday, September 9, you can print a copy from the Monroe County



website by clicking <u>HERE</u>. Also, you can contact the tax office by email at <u>townclerk@townofpittsford.org</u> or by calling 585-248-6215.

Important Tax Collection Dates:

- Monday, 9/15 First installments are due by this date.
- Tuesday, 9/16 to Saturday, 9/20 First installments can be paid with 1% interest added. Monday, 9/22 All first installment payments received in person, by drop box by this date or mailed with a 9/20 postmark, will process as on-

time payments.

• Wednesday, 10/1 – Full payments are due by this date.

School Tax Collection locations and hours:

- Town of Pittsford, Town Clerk/Tax Receivers Office: 11 South Main St; Monday Friday 8:00am to 4:00pm
- Town of Pittsford Drop Box locations: 11 South Main St; at front & back doors available 24 hours
- Canandaigua National Bank and Trust: 18 State St; Monday Friday 9:00am to 5:00pm and Saturdays 9:00am to 12:00pm (September 1 October 1 only)

On-time first installments may be paid at Canandaigua National Bank, 18 State Street, in Pittsford Village through September 15. Canandaigua National Bank will continue to accept **full payments only** from September 16 through October 1.

All payments must include a phone number and payment coupon (located on the 2 $^{\rm nd}$ page of your bill)

- Full and 1st installment payments make payable to RENEE MCQUILLEN, RECEIVER OF TAXES
- Per NYS Real Property Law, the **US postmark is used to determine the payment date** for tax payments received by mail. Payments postmarked after the due date will be assessed interest.
- If a due date falls on a weekend or holiday, payment is accepted without penalty on the next business day.
- Online bank account payment is not recommended. These payments arrive without a postmark and cannot be considered received until they arrive at the tax office. This will result in additional interest if not received by the due date.
- You may pay online by credit card at www.monroecounty.gov/etc/rp/. An additional service fee totaling 2.75% of the amount to be paid will be added by the credit card processor. Any payment less than \$100 will be charged \$2.75.
- Electronic check payments can be made at www.monroecounty.gov/etc/rp/ and are assessed a sliding scale fee based on the payment amount.

ERIE CANAL BICENTENNIAL CELEBRATION IS SEPTEMBER 27 & 28

The Village of Pittsford will host a community-wide celebration of the 200th anniversary of the Erie Canal on Saturday and Sunday, September 27 & 28, 2025. This special weekend will showcase history, music, food, and fun as Pittsford celebrates its history along the historic waterway.

One of the highlights will be the arrival of a **flotilla of canal boats**, including the *Sam Patch*, the *Riverie*, the *Colonial Bell*, and the historic replica of the **Seneca Chief**, the vessel that carried Governor DeWitt Clinton when the Canal opened in 1825. Visitors can enjoy live music, a canal history exhibit, guided tours, dance performances, and a festive welcome at Schoen Place. There will also be a **dock decorating contest, village-wide sidewalk sale**, **and plenty of activities for all ages**.


The Town of Pittsford is proud to participate as a sponsor of several events, including



PITTSFORD ROTARY FOOD DRIVE THIS SATURDAY

The Rotary Club of Pittsford's next food drive is scheduled for this Saturday, September 6. from 9:00am-noon at the Pittsford Sutherland High School bus loop. In addition to the Pittsford Food Cupboard, donations will support the Perinton Food Shelf and the Nazareth University Oak Tree Food Pantry. Gently used recent issues (past 12 months) of magazines will also be collected for distribution to various social agencies in the Rochester area.

The <u>Pittsford Food Cupboard</u> plays a crucial role in our community. Donations help ensure that local families have access to



essential food items that will promote well-being and stability. Hygiene items especially needed include shampoo, conditioner, body wash and toothpaste. Food items needed include taco shells, spaghetti sauce, canned tomatoes (crushed, whole or pureed – not diced), pudding or Jell-O, jelly or jam, rice sides, and any canned protein. **They could also use any bags you can spare!** The pantry is currently not accepting corn, black beans, white beans or green beans.

<u>The Perinton Food Shelf</u> is staffed primarily by volunteers, with a mission to combat and curb poverty and help people in need. Food supplies are donated by collections from local churches, schools, civic organizations and individuals. The shelf accepts food items in original packaging that are not expired or damaged.

<u>The Oak Tree Pantry</u> serves those within the Nazareth University community. Specific needs for the Oak Tree Food Pantry include items that can be easily prepared by students, including soups, canned meats and vegetables, and sauces. The pantry also needs granola bars, pasta, peanut butter, soap, and other hygiene products.


The Little House is located at 18 Monroe Avenue in the Village of Pittsford, next to the fire station.
