




Thursday, October 2, from 6:30 to 7:30pm: Early History of the Pittsford Community Library

# ERIE CANAL BICENTENNIAL CELEBRATION IS SEPTEMBER 27 & 28

The Village of Pittsford will host a community-wide celebration of the 200th anniversary of the Erie Canal on Saturday and Sunday, September 27 & 28, 2025. This special weekend will showcase history, music, food, and fun as Pittsford celebrates its history along the historic waterway.



One of the highlights will be the arrival of a **flotilla of canal boats**, including the Sam Patch, the Riverie, the Colonial Belle, and the **historic replica Seneca Chief**, the vessel that carried Governor DeWitt Clinton when the Canal opened in 1825. Visitors can enjoy live music, a canal history exhibit, guided tours, dance performances, and a festive welcome at Schoen Place. There will also be a **dock decorating contest**, villagewide **sidewalk sale**, and plenty of **activities for all ages**.

We're proud to contribute to the Village Celebration by hosting two Town performances in Carpenter Park at the Port of Pittsford on Sunday, September 28. Carpenter Park is located at 22 North Main Street.

At 2:00pm, we'll host the Cecilia Whalen Dance Company performance of "The Erie Canal Project," an original dance piece inspired by traditional folk music and Canal history. It is choreographed Cecilia. Whalen, Residency Artist with the Baryshnikov Arts Center, and performed by her dance company and the Nazareth University Dance Ensemble. The performance is at the Carpenter Park pavilion. In the event of rain, the event will be held at the Pittsford Community Library in the Fisher Meeting Room.

The event will begin with a brief introduction by Miss Whalen, who will discuss the inspiration behind the project and its development. The performance is funded by a grant from Monroe County, with additional funding from the Town of Pittsford. It is sponsored by Nazareth University, the Village of Pittsford and the Town of Pittsford,

and is free and open to the public.

"The Erie Canal Project" is performed by Diego Gómez, Priscilla Vasquez, Natasha Schmid, Ghislaine van den Heuvel, Rebecca Pelleri, Kai McCoy and Tara Kuhl. To learn more about her works, visit <u>Cecilia Whalen's website</u>.

At 3:00pm, musician, singer and songwriter Don Dwyer brings Songs and Stories of the Erie Canal to life. Based in the Buffalo, NY area, Don has performed across New York, Pennsylvania, Ohio, and Tennessee, sharing music that captures the history, struggles, and spirit of the 19th century.

For many years, Mr. Dwyer performed with the Irish Volunteers Civil War Band, appearing at events such as the Gettysburg Music Muster, the Windham Civil War Heritage Gathering, the President James Garfield Home Civil War Weekend, and the Mumford Civil War Weekend. He has also performed for historical societies across the region.

Don proudly honors his family's history—his 3x great-grandfather and great-uncles, Irish immigrants who fought in the Civil War—through his performances.

In addition to his repertoire of the Erie Canal and the Civil War, Don has been a part of the Irish music scene for 30 years, performing with Sons of the Gael and St. Brendan's Fancy. Visit his website to learn more: <u>Don Dwyer Civil War Music</u>.

The Town will also host the **New York State Museum's traveling exhibit, "Enterprising Waters: New York's Erie Canal,"** which will be displayed at the Spiegel Community Center (Sept. 14–20) and the Pittsford Community Library (Sept. 21–26) before moving to Schoen Place for the big weekend.

Payments may be made in person, by mail or by secure drop box. Please include your payment coupon and a contact phone number on your check. Failure to do so increases processing time. Payments can also be made online through Monroe County;

a 2.75% fee will be applied for using this online payment service. To pay online, click HERE.

Second and third installment payments cannot be accepted at Town Hall. They should be made payable to: Monroe County Treasurer and mailed to PO Box 14420, Rochester NY 14614 or delivered in person to the Monroe County Office of the Treasury (39 West Main Street, Monroe County Office Building Room B-2.)

Full payments with a 2% interest rate will be accepted from October 2 to October 31. If you need assistance with this calculation, please contact the tax office directly by email at townclerk@townofpittsford.org or by phone at 585-248-6215 to determine the correct amount due.

Please Note: We strongly discourage paying your tax bill via your banking Electronic Checking/Online bill pay system. If you are paying your bill through an online bill pay system, please be aware that your bank may still mail us a paper check without a USPS postmark. Therefore, your payment is not considered received until we physically receive the payment in our office. We do not recommend sending payment in this manner.


coffee, breakfast pastries, and popcorn while watching the film. Then, stay for lunch, featuring pizza, salad, and dessert, if you'd like.

Our Pittsford Fire Department members provide an invaluable service to our community. You have an opportunity to meet these dedicated volunteers in person and learn about what it takes to be a firefighter!

Community Open House on Saturday, October 4, from 9:00am to 11:00am at Fire Station #1, 8 Monroe Avenue (near the Main Street Four Corners). Come learn about your local volunteer fire department and the importance of fire safety. Take a tour of the station and get an up-close look at the firetrucks, tools and equipment. Learn about fire prevention. And be sure to chat with our volunteer firefighters — they'll be available to provide information, answer questions and discuss firefighting activities. Enjoy donuts and cider too! The event is free and open to the public.

First responders and representatives from Pittsford Volunteer Ambulance, Monroe County Sheriff's Office, the Monroe County Office of Traffic Safety and the STOP-DWI will also be on site, providing additional health and safety information. The Sheriff's Office will be offering SAFE CHILD services, including photo ID cards that contain the child's name, biographical information (date of birth, gender, height, weight, hair color, eye color, etc.), and a fingerprint image of both index fingers for assisting law enforcement in case a child goes missing (this is at no cost to the parents).
