TOWN CLOSURES FOR STAFF MEETING FRIDAY, 10/3

Town Hall Closing at Noon, Library and Community Center will remain open

Due to the annual Town of Pittsford staff meeting, Town Hall will close at noon on Friday, October 3. Please note this includes the Town Clerk/Tax Office. The Town Highway, Parks, and Sewer departments will also close at noon. The Pittsford Community Library and the Spiegel Pittsford Community Center will remain open, keeping their regular hours.





ROAD MEDIAN WORK BEGINS THIS MONDAY, 10/6, ON MONROE AVE AT CANAL BRIDGE One way alternating traffic Mon-Fri, 9am-3pm, until Oct 17


DDS Companies, the contractor for the Westport Crossing project, will begin work this Monday, October 6, to install a road median on Monroe Avenue just west of the Canal bridge, at the Westport Crossing project site. Monroe Avenue will be reduced to alternating one-way traffic from the signal light at

3750 Monroe Avenue to the railroad crossing just east of the Canal. The lane reduction will take place from 9:00am to 3:00pm, Monday through Friday. Traffic flagging crews will be on-site to manage traffic flow. The road median is designed as a calming island, intended to slow traffic entering the Village. DDS Companies expects the project to be completed by October 17.

SCHOOL TAXES: FULL PAYMENT DUE TODAY, WEDNESDAY, OCTOBER 1

Full payments of school taxes are due today, Wednesday, October 1, 2025. For your convenience, the Tax office will be open *today only* from 8:00am to 5:00pm.


Payments may be made in person, by mail, or by using a secure drop box available 24/7. Drop boxes are located at both the front and back entrances of the Pittsford Town Hall, 11 South Main Street. Please include your payment coupon and a contact phone number on your check. Failure to do so increases processing time. Payments can also be



made at Canandaigua National Bank, 18 State Street, in Pittsford Village, or online through Monroe County. A 2.75% fee will be applied for using this online payment service. To pay online, click <u>HERE</u>.

Reminder: Today, Wednesday, October 1, 2025, will be the **last day that Canandaigua National Bank will accept full payments.**

Second and third installment payments cannot be accepted at Town Hall. They should be made payable to: Monroe County Treasurer and mailed to PO Box 14420, Rochester NY 14614 or delivered in person to the Monroe County Office of the Treasury (39 West Main Street, Monroe County Office Building Room B-2).

Our Pittsford Fire Department members provide an invaluable service to our community. You have an opportunity to meet these dedicated volunteers in person and learn about what it takes to be a firefighter!

Join our Fire Department members for a **Community Open House** this **Saturday**,

October 4, from 9:00am to 11:00am at Fire Station #1, 8 Monroe Avenue (near the Main Street Four Corners). Come learn about your local volunteer fire department and the importance of fire safety. Take a tour of the station and get an up-close look at the firetrucks, tools and equipment. Learn about fire prevention. And be sure to chat with our volunteer firefighters — they'll be available to provide information, answer questions and discuss firefighting activities. Enjoy donuts and cider too! The event is free and open to the public.

First responders and representatives from Pittsford Volunteer Ambulance, Monroe County Sheriff's Office, the Monroe County Office of Traffic Safety and the STOP-DWI will also be on site, providing additional health and safety information. The Sheriff's Office will be offering SAFE CHILD services, including photo ID cards that contain the child's name, biographical information (date of birth, gender, height, weight, hair color, eye color, etc.), and a fingerprint image of both index fingers for assisting law enforcement in case a child goes missing (this is at no cost to the parents). The Pittsford Community Library Book Bike will also be there!

As the number of calls for service continues to grow, so does the need for volunteers. The Pittsford Volunteer Fire Department is always seeking community members interested in joining its ranks. If you would like to find out more about how you can

PITTSFORD ROTARY FOOD DRIVE THIS SATURDAY, 9AM-12PM

The Rotary Club of Pittsford's next food drive is scheduled for this Saturday, October 4, from 9:00am-noon at the Pittsford Sutherland High School bus loop. In addition to the **Pittsford Food Cupboard**, donations will support the Greece Ecumenical Food Shelf & Clothing Closer, and the Nazareth University Oak Tree Food Pantry. Gently used recent issues (past 12 months) of magazines will also be collected for distribution to various social agencies in the Rochester area.

The <u>Pittsford Food Cupboard</u> plays a crucial role in addressing food insecurity within our community. Donations help ensure that local families have access to essential food items that will promote well-being and stability. The pantry is currently in need of hygiene products (shampoo, conditioner, body wash, toothpaste), taco shells, spaghetti sauce, canned tomatoes (crushed, whole or pureed – no diced), pudding, Jello, jelly or jam, rice sides, pasta, and ANY protein in a can (7 grams or more per serving). They currently have no room for corn, black beans, white beans, or green beans, and they do not collect perishables.

The Greece Ecumenical Food Shelf & Clothing Closet is a community-supported emergency food pantry and clothing closet serving Greece & Charlotte. Current needs include canned vegetables, tuna, chicken, baked beans, chunky soups, rice, cold cereal, personal care items such as toothpaste, toothbrushes, shampoo, deodorant, and bar soap, as well as small bottles of dish detergent.

The Oak Tree Pantry serves those with food insecurity in the Nazareth University community. Specific needs for the Oak Tree Food Pantry include items that can be easily prepared by students, including soups, canned meats and vegetables, and

sauces. The pantry has an ongoing need for granola bars, pasta, peanut butter, soap and other hygiene products.

The Pittsford Rotary Club has scheduled food drives the first Saturday of the month through next spring.
