A Message from Supervisor Bill Smith NO TAX INCREASE FOR 2026

Last night I presented to the Town Board my proposed Town Budget for 2026. My proposed budget keeps the Town tax rate flat, with no increase. Cumulatively since 2018, the budgets I've presented to the Town Board for approval have cut the Town tax rate by more than 9%. Notwithstanding the pinch of inflation, the proposed budget for 2026 avoids a tax increase while maintaining funding for all of the Town's services and events. The owner of a home of the average value in Pittsford, which is



\$305,000, will pay \$955 in Town tax in 2026. Still less than a thousand dollars for the year.

Town tax still represents just 8 cents of every dollar you pay in property tax.

The Town recently received its fiscal report cards. The State Comptroller evaluates each Town in the State for fiscal stress, on a scale from 1 to 10. The more stress the higher the number. It's like a golf score: the lower the number the better you've done. Pittsford's score? – Zero. On a fiscal stress scale of 1 to 10, we're not on the stress scale at all. A perfect score.

Moody's Investors Service recently reaffirmed Pittsford's Triple-A credit rating. Again, a perfect score – the highest rating possible. The only town in upstate New York to have the Triple-A rating. The only town of our size in America to have it. Higher than the credit rating of the State of New York. Higher than the rating for the United States of America.

The public hearing on the proposed 2026 Town Budget is set for Wednesday, November 5 at 6:00pm at the Town Hall public meeting room (lower level). Note that this meeting is on a **Wednesday**, not the usual Tuesday, which is Election Day. Printed copies of the proposed Budget and my budget presentation are available at Town Hall

LEAF COLLECTION APP NOW LIVE

Yard debris pickup continues through October 30 Our crews will cycle through the Town approximately every three weeks to remove piles of loose leaves placed at the edge of the roadway, behind the curb.

Residents can track leaf collection progress in real time by using our online **Leaf Collection App at gis.townofpittsford.org/LeafCollection**.

Leaf collection reminders:

- Please keep brush, branches and other yard debris separate from leaves sticks, brush and other debris can damage the Town's vacuum equipment.
- To keep roadways safe and storm drains clear, place leaf piles at the road edge, behind the curb.
- To help our pollinators this winter and next spring consider leaving some leaves in garden beds, under bushes and trees, or in a quiet corner of your yard to shelter them.

We will collect leaves in piles throughout the season, until all leaves are collected.

Yard Debris Pickup Continues Through October 30

Town yard debris weekly pickup is ongoing and continues through October 30. This includes both bagged/containerized items and loose brush and branches.

Weekly on your Yard Debris collection day the Town collects:

- - Bagged leaves
 - Cuttings less than 3 feet in length, if bundled or in a container

Grass and smaller yard debris in paper bags or reusable containers

• Branch and brush cuttings less than 8 feet in length and less than 8 inches in diameter, placed in loose piles at the road edge, behind the curb

Please do not include sod, stumps, rocks, stones, lumber, metal or other waste material in your yard debris. All filled yard debris containers (including the debris) should weigh 50 lbs. or less.

Regular collection of bagged and containerized material, as well as loose brush and branches, ends on October 30.

Following the guidelines above helps ensure leaf and yard debris collection is timely and safe for everyone – thank you!



Monroe County offers localized emergency notifications to Pittsford residents through its Hyper-Reach service. New York State also provides a mass notification system to Pittsford residents through its NY-Alert program. See details below about these alert programs and how to sign up for them.



Monroe County Hyper-Reach Emergency **Notifications**

Pittsford residents can sign up to receive local emergency alerts through Monroe County's Hyper-Reach Emergency Notification service. Signing up allows your cell phone, email and/or TDD to be notified for local emergencies and community alerts as well. The program uses your address to provide alerts targeted to your specific geographic area. Home phone (landline) numbers are automatically registered with Monroe County's 911 Center for emergency alerts; registering for Hyper-Reach allows notifications to be sent to your mobile phone. Sign up is simple and free. Register at bit.ly/hyper-reach-signup.

NY Alert Emergency Notification System

NY-Alert is New York State's Mass Notification System. By signing up for NY-Alert, you can receive alerts, warnings and emergency information via the web, your cell phone, email and other technologies, based on the geographic location you select. Users

create an account and then subscribe to choose the types of alerts they wish to receive.

NY-Alert contains public alerts and critical, emergency-related information, including instructions and recommendations from emergency personnel in real-time. Information may include severe weather warnings, significant highway closures, hazardous material spills and other emergency conditions. Notifications can also include AMBER and missing children alerts, as well as alerts regarding consumer protection, public health, and sex offender relocation. You can receive alerts by phone, text message, email and fax machine, and you may select multiple ways to be notified. Visit https://alert.ny.gov/sign
