PUBLIC HEARING FOR PROPOSED 2026 TOWN BUDGET WEDNESDAY, NOVEMBER 5

The public hearing on the proposed 2026 Town Budget is scheduled for Wednesday, November 5, at 6:00pm, in the Town Hall public meeting room (lower level). Please note that this meeting is on a Wednesday, the day after Election Day. Printed copies of the proposed Budget are available at Town Hall in the Town Clerk's office, or you can view them online at

www.townofpittsford.org/budgets.

Proposed 2026 Budget Highlights:

- Holds tax rate flat, at \$3.13 per thousand dollars
- Increased funding for Residential Road Repaving program
- Funds for Pedestrian Safety improvements and measures to reduce speeding
- Full support for Pittsford Community Library
- Maintains full funding for Community Events and Recreation programs
- Maintains funding for Elderberry Express
- Maintains full funding for Seniors, including Senior lunch programs
- A 2% funding increase for Pittsford Youth Services
- A 2% increase in funding for Pittsford Volunteer Ambulance
- Funds the 13.9% increase in employee medical costs
- Funds the 4% increase in Dental Plan costs
- Continues Environmental initiatives, including funds for tree planting program
- A 2.9% Cost of Living Adjustment for Town staff (no increase for elected officials)

A message from Town Supervisor Bill Smith: TIPS FOR A SAFE AND HAPPY HALLOWEEN

Halloween is on Friday! If your family will be out trick-or-treating – or if you will be out on the road – be sure to plan ahead for a fun and safe evening. The National Highway Traffic Safety Administration advises that children are nearly THREE TIMES as likely to be hit by a car on Halloween than on any other day of the year. It's a sobering fact that requires attention. Don't let Halloween be scary for the wrong reasons; follow these simple yet important guidelines to make sure you, your

children and your neighbors stay safe.


- **Be visible!** Poor visibility is the biggest threat on Halloween night. Trick-or-treat before the sun goes down if you can, especially if you have younger children. Choose light-colored, fire-resistant costumes. Fasten reflective tape to costumes and bags and have everyone hold a glow stick or flashlight.
- Have a walking plan. Trick-or-treat down one side of the street at a time, stay
 within well-lit areas that have sidewalks and watch out for cars backing in and
 out of driveways.
- **Drive below the speed limit.** Little ones dart out of their parents' grasp quickly and unexpectedly; you need extra time to safely respond.
- Accompany all children under the age of 12 and remind kids of all ages to NEVER enter a stranger's home or car. Have teenagers adhere to a curfew and check in with them throughout the evening.
- Inspect children's treats when they get home. Throw away any candy with tears, holes, or damaged wrappers.

The best plan is to be aware and take care. Have a fun, safe Halloween!

PITTSFORD ROTARY CLUB'S ANNUAL ELECTION DAY PASTA SUPPER SET FOR NOVEMBER 4
The Pittsford Rotary Club's beloved Election Day Pasta Supper returns for its 59th year this upcoming Tuesday, November 4, continuing a cherished community tradition of good food and giving back. The charity fundraising event will take place from 5:00 to 7:00pm at the Pittsford Mendon High School Commons, 472 Mendon Road.

Guests can choose to dine in, take out, or use the convenient drive-thru service. The meal includes pasta and sauce, all-beef meatballs, tossed salad, a breadstick, dessert, and a beverage. Barilla America is donating the pasta, and Pittsford Farms Dairy will provide ice cream

for dessert.

"This long-standing tradition is among our fundraisers that benefit a wide range of local charities and service organizations," said Rotary Club President Richard Colby. "We warmly invite voters and their families to join us as we celebrate our freedom to vote and enjoy a meal together."

Tickets cost \$15 for adults (age 13+), \$10 for children ages 5–12, and are free for children under 5. The price at the door will be \$20, and veterans eat free.

Tickets are available online at Pittsford Rotarian, or at the door. Proceeds support numerous local charities and community organizations, including the Pittsford Food Cupboard, Veterans Outreach Center, and Pittsford Youth Services.

TWO NEW SIDEWALKS OFFER SAFER ACCESS FOR STUDENTS AND RESIDENTS

We've recently completed two sidewalk projects that enhance pedestrian safety and expand our walkable connections in Pittsford. Students and residents will find it easier and more enjoyable to get to their desired destinations and explore new ones in our community.

Barker Road sidewalk

The new sidewalk on the south side of Barker Road connects the Town's Hopkins Park and the Copper Woods neighborhood to the Barker Road Middle School. It was completed earlier this month. Drainage improvements needed for the area were included in with this project as well. See here the full Barker Road sidewalk map.


Mendon and Thornell roads sidewalk

This new sidewalk runs along the east side of Mendon Road, starting at Thornell Farm Park, turning east on Thornell Road along the north side, and ending at Oak Meadow Trail. It filled a gap between existing sidewalks on Mendon and Thornell Roads. Students and other pedestrians now have safer access from adjoining neighborhoods to get to and from Pittsford Mendon High School, Thornell Road Elementary School, and our own Thornell Farm Park, the Town's most active park. The sidewalk is finished and will be ready to walk on by Halloween! See here the full Mendon-Thornell Roads sidewalk map.

We'll have an official ribbon-cutting in the spring, once the surrounding grass has grown back in.

We have two more sidewalk projects in the works as well.

The East Street sidewalk will replace the existing asphalt sidewalk on the east side of East Street from Thornell Road to Carriage Court, and a new sidewalk will be added to the west side of East Street from Brickston Drive to Arbor Creek Road. It will include several mid-block pedestrian crosswalks. Engineering design is complete for the project. Depending on review by the Monroe County Department of Transportation for project permitting, we hope to begin construction this fall, with completion expected in mid-summer 2026.



The new **Tobey Road sidewalk** will start at the intersection of Cricket Hill Drive, Tobey Road and Stone Road and run along the north/east side of Tobey Road to the existing pedestrian crossing at the Clover Street intersection. Project design engineering is nearing completion; public information meetings will be held this fall. Some site work may begin over this winter.

PROPERTY TAX BREAKS FOR SENIORS, VETERANS, FIREFIGHTERS/AMBULANCE WORKERS, AND PEOPLE WITH A DISABILITY ON A LIMITED INCOME

Tax bill reduction possible for those who qualify
If you're age 65 or older, have a physical
disability, or are a veteran, you may be entitled
to a partial exemption from property taxes. See



details below, and please note that you must meet all requirements for the exemption you claim.

Exemption for Seniors: If you're 65 or older on December 31, 2026, and your 2024 Adjusted Gross Income is less than \$58,400, you may be eligible for an exemption that could reduce future tax bills.

Disabled with limited income exemption: You will need your award letter from the Social Security Administration. If your 2024 Adjusted

Gross Income is less than \$58,400, you may be eligible for an exemption.

For the senior and disability exemptions, "income" means your adjusted gross income for federal income tax purposes **plus** your total Social Security benefits **and** any tax-exempt interest or dividends received. It does **not** include distributions from individual retirement accounts. For more information, you can contact the Assessor's office.

Please note you may claim either a senior or a disability exemption as described above, not both. Seniors and people with disabilities on limited incomes must apply annually to receive a tax exemption. If you have received a renewal application and have not sent it back yet, please complete it and return it prior to the March 1, 2026, filing deadline.

Veteran's exemption: You will need a copy of your DD214. If you've previously qualified for the veteran's exemption, you don't need to reapply.

Firefighters' and Ambulance Workers' exemption: You will need to fill out an application; find it and further details on the Town Assessor's web page. Widows and widowers of first responders are also eligible.

Filing deadline for all exemptions: March 1, 2026. You must apply by March 1, 2026, to have the exemption applied to your taxes for the following year.

DON'T FORGET TO "FALL BACK" THIS WEEKEND

Daylight Saving Time ends at 2:00am on Sunday, November 2, so be sure to set your clocks back one hour before going to bed on Saturday night.

This marks the return to **Eastern Standard Time**, giving us an extra hour of sleep and slightly lighter mornings as we head into late fall.

As you turn your clocks back, it's also a good time to check a few household safety



items:

- Test smoke and carbon monoxide detectors and replace batteries if needed.
- Inspect flashlights and emergency kits to ensure they're ready for winter weather.
- Adjust outdoor lighting timers for shorter daylight hours.

Enjoy the extra hour and use the opportunity to plan for safety as we close out 2025 and head into 2026.

Following the presentation, the **Irondequoit Community Orchestra** will perform the **world premiere** of Daniel Pesca's "*Circe*" with soprano



Tyler Cassidy-Heacock, under the direction of conductor **Evan Meccarello**. The concert will also feature additional familiar pieces performed by the orchestra.

PITTSFORD ROTARY FOOD DRIVE THIS SATURDAY, 9AM-12PM

The Rotary Club of Pittsford's next food drive is scheduled for this Saturday, November 1, from 9:00am to noon at the Pittsford Sutherland High School bus loop. In addition to the Pittsford Food Cupboard, donations will support Rochester's Angels of Mercy and the Nazareth University Oak Tree Food Pantry. Gently used recent issues (past 12 months) of magazines will also be collected for distribution to various social agencies in the Rochester area.

The <u>Pittsford Food Cupboard</u> plays a crucial role within our community. Donations help ensure that local families have access to essential food items that will promote well-being and stability. They are now collecting for Thanksgiving! Items especially needed include frozen turkeys, cream of mushroom soup, chicken broth, turkey gravy, cranberry sauce, and canned pumpkin. Additional food pantry items needed include taco shells, breadcrumbs, barley, quinoa, spaghetti sauce, canned tomatoes (crushed,

whole or pureed- no diced), canned corn, pudding and Jello, jelly or jam, rice sides, and protein in a can, including chicken breast, Vienna sausage, corned beef, and sardines. They currently have no room for black beans, white beans, or green beans. They are also requesting personal items, including shampoo, conditioner, bodywash, and toothpaste.

<u>Angels of Mercy New York</u> is a non-profit organization in Rochester that educates, protects, and empowers women and girls facing domestic violence, human trafficking, and other life-controlling issues.

<u>The Oak Tree Pantry</u> serves those with food insecurity in the Nazareth University community. Specific needs for the Oak Tree Food Pantry include items that can be easily prepared by students, including soups, canned meats and vegetables, and sauces. The pantry also needs granola bars, pasta, peanut butter, soap, and other hygiene products.
