
PUBLIC HEARING FOR PROPOSED 2026 TOWN BUDGET IS TONIGHT

The public hearing on the proposed 2026
Town Budget is scheduled for tonight,
Wednesday, November 5, at 6:00pm, in the
Town Hall public meeting room (lower level).
Printed copies of the proposed Budget are
available at Town Hall in the Town Clerk's
office, or you can view them online at
www.townofpittsford.org/budgets.

Proposed 2026 Budget Highlights:

- Holds tax rate flat, at \$3.13 per thousand dollars
- Increased funding for Residential Road Repaving program
- Funds for Pedestrian Safety improvements and measures to reduce speeding
- Full support for Pittsford Community Library
- Maintains full funding for Community Events and Recreation programs
- Maintains funding for Elderberry Express
- Maintains full funding for Seniors, including Senior lunch programs
- A 2% funding increase for Pittsford Youth Services
- A 2% increase in funding for Pittsford Volunteer Ambulance
- Funds the 13.9% increase in employee medical costs
- Funds the 4% increase in Dental Plan costs
- Continues Environmental initiatives, including funds for tree planting program
- A 2.9% Cost of Living Adjustment for Town staff (no increase for elected officials)

PITTSFORD VETERANS DAY CEREMONY TO HONOR LOCAL HEROES TUESDAY, NOVEMBER 11 Join the Town of Pittsford and the American Legion Rayson-Miller Post 899 in honoring those who have served or are currently serving in the United States armed forces. The annual <u>Veterans Day Ceremony</u> will take place Tuesday, November 11, 2025, from 11:00am to 12:00pm at the Veterans Monument in Carpenter Park at the Port of Pittsford, 22 North Main Street.

The ceremony will include a presentation of colors, placement of wreaths, a rifle salute, and the playing of "Taps." A public reception will follow at the **American Legion Post**, located at **21 North Main Street**. All are welcome to attend this meaningful tribute to our veterans.



Honoring Our Veterans

Every year, Veterans Day is observed on November 11, commemorating the armistice that ended World War I in 1918. Originally called Armistice Day, it was renamed in 1954 to honor all U.S. military veterans. The site provides Veterans and their families with easy access to benefits, services, and resources, along with educational materials about Veterans' contributions and national observances.

Each year, the Veterans Day National Committee selects artwork for its official poster. The 2025 design, *Unified by Service* (left) by Jeremy D. Carpenter, illustrates the theme "Service to Our Nation" by

uniting all uniformed services under one flag and purpose. The poster will appear in VA facilities, military bases, and municipal buildings nationwide, as well as on the cover of the official Veterans Day program at Arlington National Cemetery.

The Pittsford Community Library will offer free public Narcan training and opioid awareness information tomorrow, November 6, from 10:00am to 1:00pm in the Library hallway. Stop by to receive a free Narcan training and a Narcan kit from the Monroe County Health Department. Narcan (Naloxone) is a nasal spray that can be administered immediately to treat an opioid overdose.

The opioid crisis continues at an alarming level. Approximately every other day, someone in Monroe County dies from an opioid overdose. There

is no community immune to this crisis – learn how to save a life with Narcan. This drop-in program is free; no registration required.

film directed and produced by Martin Scorsese!



BLOOD DRIVE AT THE LIBRARY THIS FRIDAY, NOVEMBER 7

The Town of Pittsford will host a Red Cross blood drive this Friday, November 7, from 10:00am-3:00pm at the Pittsford Community Library in the Fisher Meeting Room. The Library is located at 24 State Street in the Village of Pittsford.

In November, successful donors get free A1C testing, which is commonly used to screen for prediabetes and diabetes. (One test result per donor in 12 months; no fasting required.)

Maximize your blood donation and help more patients! If you are an eligible type O, B, or A donor, consider making a Power Red donation.

Red blood cells are the most transfused blood component.





REMEMBER: RESIDENTIAL BURNING OF BRUSH AND LEAVES IS PROHIBITED IN PITTSFORD Please note that the Town of Pittsford, in accordance with New York State and Monroe County law, prohibits the residential burning of brush and leaves.

Fires spread when the wind carries smoldering, lightweight leaves from fire pits toward nearby structures or wooded areas. Burning leaves also significantly contributes to urban air pollution. The by-products of burning leaves include hydrocarbons, carbon monoxide, and other toxic

or irritating chemicals. Tiny smoke particles emitted can accumulate in the lungs, leading to long-term health problems. Leaf burning not only poses health risks to humans but also creates dangerous conditions for wildlife and plants.

Remember, leaving a thin layer of leaves where they fall provides habitat, insulation, and protection for our insect pollinators! Leaves also serve as natural fertilizer for grass as they break down over the winter months. Even piling leaves over garden beds and around trees and shrubs offers hibernating pollinators protection.

To remove leaves, we recommend regularly mulching them into your lawn as they fall. If leaf coverage becomes too thick for mulching, place leaves in a pile at the end of your front yard (behind the curb or gutter), and our leaf crews will remove them. <u>Click here</u> to use our real-time Leaf Collection application. <u>Visit our website</u> for helpful tips on leaf collection.

BE AN H₂O HERO: KEEP YOUR STORM DRAIN CLEAR OF LEAVES

Now that autumn leaves have fallen, there's one simple action every Pittsford resident can take to protect our community and local waterways — find the storm drain nearest your home and keep it clear of leaves and debris.

When leaves gather on or near storm drains, rainwater cannot flow properly into the drainage system. This causes water to back up along streets and sidewalks, leading to localized flooding, slippery surfaces, and icy patches when temperatures drop. Blocked drains not only cause flooding but also harm the environment. When leaves and debris wash into the stormwater system, they decompose and release nutrients such as nitrogen and phosphorus, which drain into our local watershed and promote harmful algae growth in nearby waterways.

How You Can Help

 Locate the storm drain nearest your home or business. Many are marked with the blue "Drains to Lake" or "H₂O Hero" storm drain markers installed throughout Monroe County. If yours don't have one, you can order free markers to install in your neighborhood from the H₂O Hero website. These markers are part of the regional H₂O Hero program. This public education initiative reminds us that, unlike the water that goes down our indoor faucets, what goes down our storm drains flows directly into our waterways untreated.

- Keep that drain clear of leaves, sticks, and trash. Rake leaves away from the curb and pile them behind the curbline for Town pickup, never in the street.
- Avoid sweeping or blowing leaves into the roadway — they can block drains and are unsafe for drivers and bicyclists.
- Separate yard debris such as sticks and brush from leaf piles to prevent equipment damage and delays during collection.

Why It Matters

Every storm drain connects to a larger system that leads directly to our creeks, ponds, the Erie Canal, and Lake Ontario, and NOT to a treatment plant. That means any debris, fertilizers, or pollutants that enter the drain travel straight into the waterways where we fish, paddle, and play. By keeping just one drain clear, you can prevent hundreds of gallons of stormwater runoff from being polluted.

Join the H₂O Hero Effort

By protecting your neighborhood storm drain,

you're helping to safeguard Pittsford's natural resources and doing your part as an **H₂O Hero**. Encourage your neighbors to join in — take a short walk after raking, find your local drain, and make sure it's free of leaves.

Together, small actions add up to cleaner water, safer streets, and a healthier environment for everyone.


