BUDGET FOR 2026 PASSED: NO TAX INCREASE, ALL SERVICES MAINTAINED

Town Supervisor Bill Smith presented his 2026 Town budget at the October 21, 2025 Town Board meeting. It was approved without change at the November 5, 2025 Town Board meeting after a Public Hearing. The Supervisor's budget holds the Town tax rate flat – with no increase to the tax rate. It continues funding for all of the Town's services and events.

THANKSGIVING HOLIDAY HOURS

Town of Pittsford offices, facilities, and services, including Town Hall, the Parks and Sewer departments, and Town Court will close at 1:00pm on Wednesday, November 26 and remain closed Thursday (11/27) and Friday (11/28) in observance of the Thanksgiving holiday. The Town Highway Department will be closed on Thursday, November 27; regular Town leaf collection services will be provided on Friday,

November 28.

The Spiegel Community Center will close at 5:00pm on Wednesday, November 26 and remain closed on Thursday (11/27) and Friday (11/28). The Community Center will resume regular hours on Saturday (11/29), from 8:00am - 8:00pm.

The Pittsford Community Library will close at 5:00pm on Wednesday, November 26, and will remain closed on Thursday (11/27) and Friday (11/28). The Library will resume regular hours (10:00am - 5:00pm) on Saturday, November 29. In case of an emergency requiring Town of Pittsford services during holiday closure, please call (585) 248-6212.

TOWN LEAF COLLECTION CONTINUES <u>Scheduled</u> BRUSH pickup has ended for the season

Our crews continue to cycle through the Town approximately every three weeks to collect piles of loose leaves placed at the edge of the roadway, behind the curb. Because crews and equipment are needed for leaf collection, and leaves are processed separately from yard debris, regularly scheduled yard debris collection has ended for the season. In several weeks, once we've substantially completed leaf collection, crews will make another brush pickup throughout the town.



Residents can track collection progress in real time using the **online Leaf Pickup App** at <u>gis.townofpittsford.org/LeafCollection</u>.

To help ensure efficient collection:

- Rake loose leaves (only) into piles at the edge of the road or shoulder, not into the street or gutters
- To keep roadways safe and storm drains clear, place leaf piles at the road edge, behind the curb
- Keep leaves separate; don't include any other materials such as brush, branches, or debris — these can damage the Town's leaf vacuum equipment and are not processed with leaves
- Avoid placing leaves near mailboxes, hydrants, utility poles, or drainage ditches
- To help our pollinators this winter and next spring consider leaving some leaves in garden beds, under bushes and trees, or in a quiet corner of your yard to shelter them

We will collect leaves in piles throughout the season, until all leaves are collected.

TOWN OF PITTSFORD WINTER PARKING RULES IN EFFECT

As winter approaches, residents are reminded that seasonal parking restrictions are in place to allow for safe and efficient snowplowing throughout Pittsford.

An overnight parking ban is in effect in the Village from November 1 through April 15, prohibiting parking on any street, including state roads, between 2:00am and 6:00am. Vehicles in violation may be ticketed or

From November 15 through April 1, on-street parking is prohibited on all public roads,

including shoulders and state highways. This rule makes sure that snowplows can safely

UPDATE FOR LOCAL EMERGENCY NOTFICIATIONS - SIGN UP REQUIRED

Monroe County announced it has transitioned to a new, enhanced emergency notification system called MonroeAlert, which went live on November 17, 2025. Pittsford residents previously could sign up for alerts through the County's Hyper-Reach service; MonroeAlert replaces the previous alert system and requires participants to reregister for notifications.



MonroeAlert sends emergency alerts, notifications and updates to your devices directly from Monroe County 9-1-1 and Office of Emergency Management via text message, phone call or mobile app notification. Now in its 10th year, Pittsford's ceremony reflects the community's longstanding support of Wreaths Across America's mission to "Remember the fallen, Honor those who serve, and Teach the next generation the value of freedom." Two live evergreen wreaths, provided by Gallea's Florist, will be placed at the Veterans Monument as a living memorial, symbolizing respect, gratitude, and remembrance. The wreaths will remain on display through January 2.

The ceremony will feature the singing of the National Anthem, recitation of the Pledge of Allegiance, participation by the Rayson-Miller Color Guard, and remarks from representatives of the Women's Club of Pittsford, Town Supervisor Bill Smith, and Village Mayor Alysa Plummer. The event will conclude with the playing of "Taps."
