



Pittsford Ballet is a program of the Pittsford Recreation Department. Come enjoy this classic holiday favorite performed by talented local dancers!


### SUPERVISOR SATURDAY WITH BILL SMITH AT THE LIBRARY





# PITTSFORD ROTARY FOOD DRIVE THIS SATURDAY, 9AM – 12PM

The Rotary Club of Pittsford's next food drive is scheduled for this Saturday, December 6, from 9:00am-noon at the Pittsford Sutherland High School bus loop. In addition to the Pittsford Food Cupboard, donations will support the Nazareth University Oak Tree Food Pantry. Gently used recent issues (past 12 months) of magazines will also be collected for distribution to various social agencies in the Rochester area.



The <u>Pittsford Food Cupboard</u> plays a crucial role within our community.

Donations help ensure that local families have access to essential food items that will promote well-being and stability. The pantry is currently collecting items for its annual Christmas brunch, including jam, corned beef hash, Spam, syrup, and regular-ground coffee. They currently have no space for corn, black beans, white beans, or green beans. Prefer to shop online? You can also donate via the <a href="#">Amazon Pittsford Food Cupboard</a> wish list; items will be sent directly to the PFC.

The Oak Tree Pantry serves those with food insecurity in the Nazareth University community. Specific needs for the Oak Tree Food Pantry include items that can be easily prepared by students, including soups, canned meats and vegetables, and sauces. The pantry also needs granola bars, pasta, peanut butter, soap, and other hygiene products.
