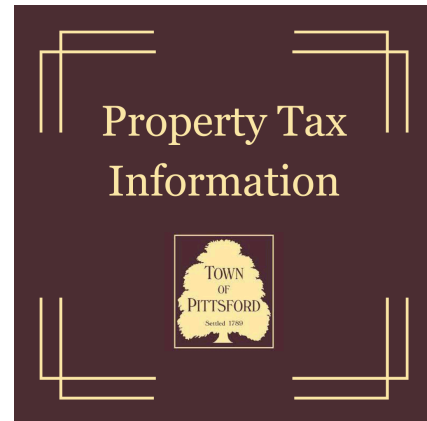

2026 TOWN AND COUNTY TAX BILLS – DUE 2/10

If you are not in escrow, the County has sent you your 2026 Town and County property tax bill in the mail by this time. If you haven't received it yet, please do one of the following:

- 1) Download and print a copy directly from the [Monroe County website](#)
- 2) Call the Town Tax Office at 585-248-6215 or email the Town Clerk/Tax Receiver at townclerk@townofpittsford.org, and they will email you a copy of the bill.



The deadline for **interest-free** Town and County property tax payment deadline is **Tuesday, February 10**. First installments will be interest-free **if paid no later than Tuesday, February 10**.

County Tax Law imposes interest on any payment made after February 10. **The Town has no authority whatsoever to waive or excuse payment of interest, regardless of the reason for late payment.**

Please read all the instructions and information on the back of your bill carefully. ***Please include your payment coupon (page 2 of your bill) and a contact phone number with your check.*** Failure to do so will increase processing time.

How to make your payment:

- **By mail to:** Renee McQuillen, Receiver, 11 South Main Street, Pittsford NY 14534
- **In person,** Monday through Friday, 8:00am to 4:00pm, at Pittsford Town Hall, 11 South Main Street, or through the mail slots (into locked boxes) available 24/7 at both the front and back entrances.
 - For cash payments, we ask that you bring the exact amount, and please call ahead for an appointment to ensure we have proper staffing.
- **First Installments and full payments can also be made at Canandaigua National Bank, 18 State Street, in Pittsford Village, through February 10,**

2026.

- Pay online through Monroe County by credit card or check debit. Please note that there is a 2.75% fee for credit card payments and a sliding-scale fee for check debit payments. To pay online, click [HERE](#).

As in the past, we **strongly** advise that you do NOT pay by electronic check, as these payments do not receive a U.S. postmark and may arrive late. If your payment arrives late, the County Tax Law imposes interest on it, **which the Town has no authority to waive or excuse**. If you choose to pay your tax bill through your bank's online bill pay (electronic banking) system, please be aware that your bank still generates and mails a paper check to the Town, and it may take up to 2 weeks to reach the Town's offices. This type of mail does not receive a USPS postmark. Therefore, the Town can only consider your payment received on the date it is physically received in our office. If the payment is received after the deadline, it will be considered late and will accrue interest and penalties.

DOG LICENSE RENEWALS NOW AVAILABLE ONLINE FOR PITTSFORD RESIDENTS

Pittsford dog owners can now renew their dog licenses quickly and conveniently online! The new online renewal option allows residents to look up current licenses using a license number, dog name, or owner name and complete payment electronically.

Please note that this service is for **current licenses only**. If your dog's license has expired, renewal must be completed in person at the Town Clerk's Office in Town Hall.



To be eligible for online renewal, your dog's **rabies vaccination must be up to date**. Proof of vaccination may be emailed to **townclerk@townofpittsford.org**. Once the information is updated in the Town's system, you will be able to complete the renewal online if the license is still current.

Online renewals are processed through the Quickpay payment system, which charges a small processing fee that does not go to the Town. Fees are **\$1.75 for debit/credit card transactions** and **\$2.50 for e-checks** per transaction.

After completing payment online, a notification will be sent directly to the Town Clerk's Office. Renewals are typically processed within **three business days**, and your updated license will be emailed to the address you provide during the transaction. Be sure to select "save" if you wish to keep a copy of your payment confirmation.

Please remember:

- **Online system is for renewals only**
- **New dog licenses must be issued in person** at the Town Clerk's Office, Town Hall, 11 South Main Street

CHRISTMAS TREE RECYCLING UNDERWAY

It may be snowy white outside, but you can still be green this winter when you recycle your Christmas tree! Town of Pittsford crews are currently collecting Christmas trees placed curbside, provided all plastic wrapping and decorations have been removed.



Weather permitting, tree collection takes place each year from **the week after Christmas through the end of January.**

Residents also may drop off trees at the **Town of Pittsford Highway Garage, 60 Golf Avenue, from 7:00am until dark, Monday through Saturday.** If you plan to arrive after 3:30pm on a weekday or on a Saturday, please call ahead at (585) 248-6270.

All collected trees are chipped and reused as mulch. Free mulch will be available to Town residents this spring at the East Street

storage bins (enter at 34 East Street), located just before the gate to the Town Parks Department office building.

Recycling your tree helps reduce waste and supports our community's sustainability efforts. Thank you so much for doing your part!

FREE AARP TAX PREPARATION APPOINTMENTS FOR SENIORS

Free tax preparation assistance will once again be available to Pittsford seniors this tax season, provided by trained AARP Tax-Aide volunteers.

Beginning **Monday, January 12**, seniors may call the **Pittsford Seniors Office at (585) 248-6235** to schedule an appointment. Appointments are required.

AARP tax preparers will be on site at the **Spiegel Community Center on Fridays from February 6 through March 27** to assist with 2026 tax filings. Trained volunteers will help eligible seniors prepare and file their returns at no cost.

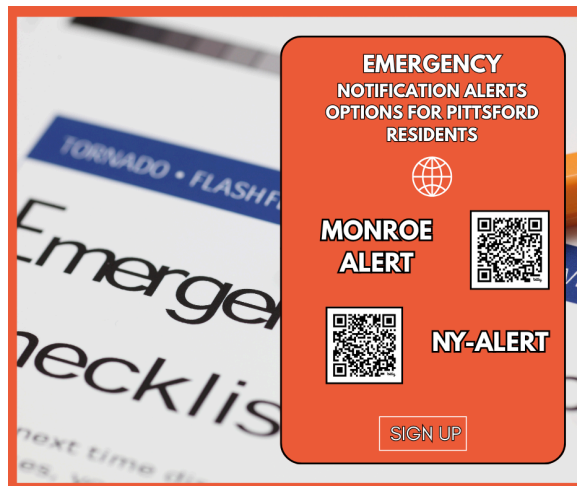

STAY INFORMED: EMERGENCY ALERT OPTIONS FOR PITTSFORD RESIDENTS

Pittsford residents have access to several reliable emergency alert systems that provide timely notifications about severe weather, public safety concerns, evacuations, missing persons, and more. Below is an overview of the major emergency notification options available to our community and how to sign up.



MonroeAlert Emergency Notifications

Localized emergency alerts are available through the [MonroeAlert Emergency Notification system](#). This enhanced alerting platform replaces the County's former Hyper-Reach service. *If you were enrolled in Hyper-Reach, you must **re-register** to continue receiving alerts.*

MonroeAlert delivers official messages directly from **Monroe County 9-1-1** and the **Office of Emergency Management** via text message, phone call, or mobile app notification. Alerts may include:

- Law enforcement or public safety activity
- Severe weather or emergency situations
- Shelter-in-place or evacuation instructions
- Major public safety threats

New York State NY-Alert Mass Notification System

In addition, New York State offers its [NY-Alert mass notification system](#). After creating an account, users can customize the alerts they receive and the way they receive them, including phone, text, email, or fax.

NY-Alert notifications may include:

- Severe weather warnings
- Major road closures or traffic incidents
- Hazardous material spills
- Public health and safety advisories
- AMBER and missing child alerts
- Consumer protection alerts
- Sex offender relocation notifications

Additional Ways to Receive Emergency Information

Along with MonroeAlert and NY-Alert, residents are encouraged to use these complementary alert tools:

- **Wireless Emergency Alerts (WEA)** – Built into most smartphones; automatically delivers critical federal, state, and local alerts such as tornado warnings, imminent threats, and AMBER Alerts. Check your phone settings to ensure alerts are enabled.
- **NOAA Weather Radio** – Provides continuous weather broadcasts and emergency information, even during power or internet outages.
- **FEMA App** – Offers real-time weather alerts, preparedness tips, and disaster resources.
- **Local TV, radio, and trusted news outlets** – Remain important sources for updates during fast-moving situations.
