

2026 TOWN AND COUNTY TAX BILLS – DUE 2/10

If you are not in escrow, the County has sent you your 2026 Town and County property tax bill in the mail by this time. If you haven't received it yet, please do one of the following:

- 1) Download and print a copy directly from the [Monroe County website](#)
- 2) Call the Town Tax Office at 585-248-6215 or email the Town Clerk/Tax Receiver at townclerk@townofpittsford.org, and they will email you a copy of the bill.

The deadline for **interest-free** Town and County property tax payment is **Tuesday, February 10**. First installments will be interest-free **if paid no later than Tuesday, February 10**.

County Tax Law imposes interest on any payment made after February 10. **The Town has no authority whatsoever to waive or excuse payment of interest, regardless of the reason for late payment.** Therefore, by law, the Town is not permitted to do so.

Please read all the instructions and information on the back of your bill carefully. **Please include your payment coupon (page 2 of your bill) and a contact phone number with your check.** Failure to do so will increase processing time.


How to make your payment:

- **By mail to:** Renee McQuillen, Receiver, 11 South Main Street, Pittsford, NY 14534
- **In person,** Monday through Friday, 8:00am to 4:00pm, at Pittsford Town Hall, 11 South Main Street, or through the mail slots (into locked boxes) available 24/7 at both the front and back entrances.

- For cash payments, we ask that you bring the exact amount, and please call ahead for an appointment to ensure we have proper staffing.
- **First Installments and full payments** can also be made at Canandaigua National Bank, 18 State Street, in Pittsford Village, through February 10, 2026.
- **Pay online** through Monroe County by credit card or check debit. Please note that there is a 2.75% fee for credit card payments and a sliding-scale fee for check debit payments. To pay online, click [HERE](#).
- As in the past, we **strongly** advise that you do NOT pay by electronic check, as these payments do not receive a U.S. postmark and may arrive late. If your payment arrives late, the County Tax Law imposes interest on it, **which the Town has no authority to waive or excuse**. If you choose to pay your tax bill through your bank's online bill pay (electronic banking) system, please be aware that your bank still generates and mails a paper check to the Town, and it may take up to 2 weeks to reach the Town's offices. This type of mail does not receive a USPS postmark. Therefore, the Town can only consider your payment received on the date it is physically received in our office. If the payment is received after the deadline, it will be considered late and will accrue interest and penalties.

MONROE COUNTY EXPANDS CURBSIDE RECYCLING PROGRAM TO INCLUDE PAPER AND PLASTIC TO-GO CUPS

Monroe County has announced that **paper and plastic to-go cups are now accepted for recycling!** This expansion allows households to recycle clean, empty paper cups and clear and white plastic takeout cups, such as those used for fountain sodas and hot and iced coffee, keeping them out of landfills and enabling their conversion into new products. The Monroe County Recycling Center (MCRC) receives recyclables from haulers across the region. You can now place these items in your recycling bin, and your waste management provider will collect them and bring them to the MCRC for recycling.




To prepare products for recycling, residents should:

1. Empty any remaining contents.
2. Dispose of straws and stirrers in the trash.
3. Reattach lids and keep paper sleeves on cups for recycling.
4. Place acceptably clean & empty cups loose in their recycling carts.

Colored plastic party cups, foam cups, and biodegradable plastic cups are NOT accepted for recycling. A full list of acceptable recyclables and other resources can be found at www.monroecounty.gov/recycling.

It's estimated that nearly 50 billion paper cups are disposed of each year in the U.S. When we recycle paper and plastic cups, we recover valuable resources and keep them circulating into new products.


Lesser Known Rochester Stories,




PITTSFORD HIGHLANDS CHORUS WELCOMES NEW SINGERS

Pink the Rink is a beloved community tradition supporting the [Breast Cancer Coalition of Rochester](#). Players from both teams will wear pink-themed attire as a symbol of solidarity, with **net proceeds from the event donated to the Coalition**.
